It is understood that he request on the part of Evans for a survey of the island is preliminary to the filing of a formal request for ts purchase. The island is said to represent valuable fishing rights.

White Pine Pest in Western Oregon

Washington, D. C. - Discovery of white pine blister rust by plant pathologists of the department of agriculare on both wild and cultivated currants in Tillamook and Clatsop counties, bringing the rust infection within 175 miles of the great sugar pine forests of southern Oregon and northern California, will probably result in an agricultural quarantine applying to at least the western portion of Oregon,

t was announced. It is proposed by the federal horicultural board to prohibit movement from Oregon into other states and territories of all five-leafed pines and currant and gooseberry plants, the later being described as "intermediate host" plants, which carry the disease from one pine tree to another. A hearing on the quarantine will be held before the board here on January 8, at which interested parties may appear.

Co-operation of Oregon state authorties in stamping out the rust epidemic must be assured before the quarantine will be limited to western Oregon, it was stated. Otherwise it will be aplied to the entire state.

The disease already exists in the ortheastern states, in the middle west and in Washington. The culivated black current is blamed for nuch of the spread, and for that reaon is being eradicated in the infected Good to look at ; good to eat, Our areas.

Congress Again is a Slow Coach

Insurgents in Revolt, But House Organizes Speedily; Senate is Slower.

Washington, D. C. - The 69th congress, elected with President Coolidge 13 months ago, took over legislative

control of the nation Monday. With its insurgents already on warpath, the body that is to provide the new \$325,000,000 tax reduction and wrestle with the world court, farm relief, prohibition, the Mitchell air defense program and coal legislation came into power.

With almost a mid-session momentum the house put the new tax reduction bill at the head of its calendar and prepared to go to work at once.

Meantime the senate, after its customary manner, was organizing leisurely and putting off its decision regarding the recognition to be given republican insurgents on its big com-

In the house that issue had been settled by the open revolt of the Wisconsin delegation against the party slate of house officials.

Declaring their intention to oppose the tax bill which was all ready to be reported to the house and to vote on all other legislation as they saw fit was given by the insurgent group in a statement issued by the Wisconsin group through Representative Frear and endorsed by the full group after an organization meeting at which Representative Nelson of Wisconsin was re-elected chairman.

"We refuse to compromise," the statement said, "or to bargain with Mr. Longworth or with any other member of the house on an issue affecting our rights as representatives in congress to vote our convictions of duty
