News Notes From All Over Oregon

Gleaned by the Western Newspaper Union for Busy People

Linfield college at McMinnville has opened a campaign for a \$500,000 building fund.

The Marion county school census shows a gain of 33 for the year 1925 when compared with the census of a year ago.

Dr. G. T. Kornick of Stayton was elected president of the Willamette Valley Veterinarians' association which was organized at Salem.

A gain of 11.79 per cent was made in receipts at the Eugene postoffice in November this year over those of the same month last year.

The L. D. Leon store at Monitor was entered Tuesday night and several hundred dollars' worth of dry goods, boots and shoes and other articles stolen.

Wheat land, leases on land and farming equipment outfits having an aggregate value of about \$45,000 have changed hands recently in the vicinity of Adams.

Achiel Deneweth, aged 45, of Hillsboro, killed himself by slashing his throat with a razor. His action was the termination of a series of nervous disorders and a long illness.

Reports received from Crater lake national park are that there are 30 inches of snow at the lake rim, 20 inches at Anna Spring camp and 10 inches at the Klamath entrance.

Ezra Meeker, 95, Oregon trail pioneer, is in Washington, D. C., to ask congress to authorize 50-cent pieces commemorating the 75th anniversary of the march of pioneers over this route.

Improvements, costing about \$400,000, will be made in the plant of the Beaver Portland Cement company at Gold Hill within the next few months, doubling the capacity of the present plant.

Gold Hill, which recently voted an additional bond issue of \$15,000 to reconstruct its water system, will have its water rates increased from 15 to 100 per cent, the city council has announced.

One hundred and four mills reporting to West Coast Lumbermen's association for the week ending November 28, manufactured 93,041,098 of feet lumber; sold 114,736,075 feet and shipped 87,261,685 feet.

There were 22,312 traffic accidents in Portland during the fiscal year ending November 30, and a total of 35 deaths from automobile accidents, according to figures compiled. Of the 35 deaths 11 were due to drunken drivers.

More than 100 Forest Grove high school students were reinstated in their classes after a spectacular strike in protest against a three-day suspension of a small group for "cutting" classes to attend a recent football game at Independence.

Purchase of the plant and line of the Tillamook County Mutual Telephone company by the Pacific Telephone & Telegraph company was formally approved by the interstate commerce commission, which found the merger to be in the public interest.

Another large water-filled crater has made its appearance in the Tumalo reservoir basin, the result of a cave-in of part of the reservoir floor. This new hole is 38 feet in depth and is the largest of a series of holes above a subterranean cavern.

The state supreme court has held as legal an assessment of 5 cents an acre levied against all lands in the Ochoco irrigation district in Crook county. The assessment was levied by the board of directors of the district to take care of delinquencies.

The state game commission aims to build up a stock of wild turkeys in the woods of Oregon. It was indicated in the monthly report of E. Averill, state game warden. The report shows that 15 wild turkeys, five from Maryland and ten from Arizona, were received by the commission during November.

Members of the Oregon state game commission arrived in Klamath Falls Monday to make a thorough inspection of the lands of the lower Klamath lake before they make any recommendations.

An bill of exceptions filed with County Clerk Boyer at Salem, Will R. King, Portland attorney, contends that the state of Oregon has no right to hang Tom Murray until he has completed serving a prior sentence of 20 years for bank robbery. Murray is under sentence to hang December 18 for the murder of John Sweeney, prison guard, who was killed in the prison break August 12, 1925. Murray was serving a sentence of 20 years for robbing a bank in Linn county.

Washington county pays the lowest average salary of \$206.24 a month average salary to men teachers, the average being \$112.77. For women teachers Klamath county ranks highest, the average monthly salary being \$146.30. Women teachers in Union county receive an average of \$100.65, which is the lowest.

A protest against the request of H. B. Evans of Portland for a survey of Grassy island in the Columbia river as the property of the United States was filed with the commissioner of the general land office at Washington, D. C., by Attorney-General Van Winkle. The protest on the part of the state contends that the island sought by Evans is the property of the state and not under the jurisdiction of the federal government. It is understood that the request on the part of Evans for a survey of the island is preliminary to the filing of a formal request for its purchase. The island is said to represent valuable fishing rights.

White Pine Pest in Western Oregon
Washington, D. C. — Discovery of white pine blister rust by plant pathologists of the department of agriculture on both wild and cultivated currants in Tillamook and Clatsop counties, bringing the rust infection within 175 miles of the great sugar pine forests of southern Oregon and northern California, will probably result in an agricultural quarantine applying to at least the western portion of Oregon, it was announced.

It is proposed by the federal horticultural board to prohibit movement from Oregon into other states and territories of all five-leaved pines and currant and gooseberry plants, the latter being described as "intermediate host" plants, which carry the disease from one pine tree to another. A hearing on the quarantine will be held before the board here on January 8, at which interested parties may appear.

Co-operation of Oregon state authorities in stamping out the rust epidemic must be assured before the quarantine will be limited to western Oregon, it was stated. Otherwise it will be applied to the entire state.

The disease already exists in the northeastern states, in the middle west and in Washington. The cultivated black currant is blamed for much of the spread, and for that reason is being eradicated in the infected areas.

Two Slayers of John Cloutier Convicted
Montesano, Wash. — Mr. and Mrs. Arthur McCallum, who formerly resided in the Wynooche valley, were found guilty by a jury in superior court here of murder in the second degree, in connection with the death of John E. Cloutier, September 23. Leniency was recommended for the woman.

Declaring their intention to oppose the tax bill which was all ready to be reported to the house and to vote on all other legislation as they saw fit was given by the insurgent group in a statement issued by the Wisconsin group through Representative Frear and endorsed by the full group after an organization meeting at which Representative Nelson of Wisconsin was re-elected chairman.

"We refuse to compromise," the statement said, "or to bargain with Mr. Longworth or with any other member of the house on an issue affecting our rights as representatives in congress to vote our convictions of duty to our constituents."

But even without their help the republican organization had votes to spare for election to the speakership of Nicholas Longworth of Ohio, son in law of Theodore Roosevelt, the republican floor leader in the last session.
