News Notes From All Over Oregon

Gleaned by the Western Newspaper Union for Busy People

Coo's county will recruit its timber areas in 1926.

C. R. Wade of Bandon was chosen to head the chamber of commerce of that city for the ensuing year.

Sale of the old federal building in Portland is proposed in a bill introduced in congress by Senator Stanford.

A home and school for boys and a home for the aged will be established by the Eugene Bible university at Eugene.

The First National bank of Wheeler are being sold by its directors and officers to the First National bank of Tillamook.

Citizens of McMinnville at a mass meeting, unanimously approved immediate adherence to the world court by the United States.

More holes, in a line with the series of craters which recently came into existence, have made their appearance in the Tumalo reservoir basin.

Two cases of sleeping sickness, one of them fatal, were reported to the Portland city health office, the first cases the city has had in several weeks.

State hunting and fishing licenses for 1926 are now on sale throughout Oregon by sporting goods dealers, the state game and fish commission announces.

Dean Stanley, 24, night yard foreman for the Algoma Lumber company at Klamath Falls, died from injuries sustained when the band saw in the lumber mill broke.

Klamath county chamber of commerce has vigorously protested against withdrawal of the division offices of the state highway department in Klamath Falls January 1.

Members of the state board of forestry together with federal forestry officials spent Friday and Saturday in Coos county in an effort to reach some agreement relative to slash disposal.

Since construction was resumed in August, following the annual summer rise, nine new dams have been built by the government engineers on the Columbia river and two old structures extended.

A special committee has been named by the Exchange club of Pendleton to study conditions among Indians on the Umatilla reservation with the idea of suggesting a program that may prove of aid to the Indians.

There are more children of school age in Bend than in any other town in Oregon east of the Cascades. Bend's school population is 3040. The gain in the number of school children is 10 per cent over that of last year.

Opening of the new section of the Grants Pass-Crescent City highway will be postponed indefinitely by a slide of more than 2,000 cubic feet of rock and earth, which occurred be-

tween Elk creek and Patrick creek.

B. C. Seydel of Portland, who has the contract to build the 3,000,000-gallon reservoir on Skinner's butte for the city of Eugene, has some of his equipment on the ground and expects to start excavating in a short time.

The state game commission has three pet deer that are available to anyone who desires them for some game park. These animals are at Pochontas, nine miles from Baker, and consist of a buck, doe and buck fawn.

J. J. Aldred, linen manufacturer, with headquarters at Lockport, N. Y., probably will be manager of the proposed new \$650,000 linen mill which will be erected at Salem next year, it was announced by the board of directors.

At a cost in excess of \$1,000,000, a paper mill is to be erected on property adjacent to the Mickle mills on North Portland harbor early next year by the George T. Mickle Lumber company and the Mickle mills, it is announced.

Damage estimated at \$100,000, injury to one fireman and narrow escapes on the part of several students and faculty members resulted from a fire which destroyed the central portion of Science hall of Oregon Agricultural college.

Sales by mills of the West Coast Lumbermen's association in the week ending December 12 aggregated 122,821,917 feet, the highest total for many months and possibly a high record for any week of this year. This amount of sales was made by 102 mills which forwarded reports for the week. These mills manufactured 97,093,267 feet and shipped 105,876,538 feet of lumber.

Five persons were killed and 521 were injured in traffic accidents in Oregon during November, according to a report by T. A. Raffety, chief inspector for the state motor vehicle

department. Four of the fatalities were in Portland.

Thirty million feet of timber from 1000 acres of land were sold to nine bidders in a public sale conducted by the land office at Roseburg. The sale of timber netted the government \$60,280.33. All of the timber is in Coos and Lane counties.

A premature Christmas vacation was forced on the teacher and 23 pupils of the Independence rural schoolhouse several miles from Medford when that structure with its organ, library and other contents was destroyed by fire.

Recommendations to the state game commission that the headwaters of all main streams in the county be closed to fishing and that the season be opened for hunting elk were made by the Umatilla County Fish and Game Conservation association.

Investments of all insurance companies in Oregon on December 31, 1924, aggregated \$76,759,300.04, as against \$59,964,580 on December 31, 1922, according to a report completed by William A. Mullen, deputy state insurance commissioner.

Over the objection of Senator Johnson, republican of California, a senate judiciary sub-committee agreed to report favorably the nomination of Wallace McCamant of Oregon to be circuit judge of the Ninth United States circuit court of appeals.

A proclamation was issued by Governor Pierce calling a special election in the proposed Umpqua improvement district. The election, the first to be held in the state under the law passed by the recent legislature, is to take place on January 25.

One man was seriously injured, four more were severely burned about the arms and face and damage of \$9000 was caused by a fire in the rock crusher of the Marsh Construction company, 50 miles north of Klamath Falls, on The Dalles-California highway.

Turmoil in Zion

This Christmas, Americans Prepare Tree For Pilgrims Who Fill Jerusalem.

Jerusalem.—Christmas season this year finds the Bible lands once more disturbed by fighting and with little of that atmosphere of "peace on earth and good will toward men," which is the conventional greeting on this greatest of Christian feast days.

In Jerusalem, which stands on a lofty plateau as if holding itself aloof from the quarrelling Mohammedan Druses and Christians in the valley below, the missionaries and American near east organization are providing hospitality for pilgrims, tourists and refugees in the spirit of the season.

Weary pilgrims from far countries are climbing the roads to the city 2500 feet above sea level, to rest in hotels, hospices and convents before filing out the single road to Bethlehem to worship at the marble manger which marks the traditional spot of the birthplace of Christ.

There will be a distinctly American touch to this year's celebration with funds sent from the United States. The American Y. M. C. A. is providing for the first time in history a community Christmas tree which is to be for all denominations, Jews, Christians and Mohammedans. The tree will be set up in the field of Boaz, where the shepherds watched their flocks by night and it will be lighted by electricity and decorated like the community trees in the United States.

Thousands of pilgrims and tourists will see the tree as they come over the road from Jerusalem on foot and by donkey, horse or automobile.
