

Kelantan Waxes Fat on Rubber

Steeping Climate of Malay State Swathes Hills in Densest Forests.

Washington.-American automobile owners unknowingly helped to pay the award of nearly \$2,000,000, which the Malay state of Kelantan recently gave on court order to an Englishman. Kelantan is waxing financially fat on rubber so the treasury probably found no difficulty in compensating the winner of the case, which, among other things, revealed how English commerce penetrated Kelantan back in the eighties and how the state was incorporated into the British empire

Kelantan's present prospects and the improvements effected in its government are related in a bulletin of the National Geographic society from its headquarters in Washington, D. C.

Has Mountains Florida Lacks.

"Think of the Malay peninsula as an elongated Florida tacked on southeast Asia. Singapore shall be Key West; then the southern boundary of Kelantan is approximately in the position of Orlando and the northern boundary is 150 miles above, that is, at Jacksonville, Fla. Kelantan is 60 miles deep, which is a trifle more than haif the width of Florida. Since Kelantan lies five degrees from the equator, it would be quite willing to trade mountains for a bit of Florida's

"Miami had a 14-inch fall of rain recently which seems to put it in the running with Kelantan where over 100 inches fall annually in the plains districts. When the figures are all in Florida's average will be shown only one-third as great. Kelantan's steeping climate swathes its hills in the densest of tropical forests. The jungle is matted above ground and matted below. An American surveyor boring for a bridge pier cut through 100 feet of crushed and rotting leaves and branches to find the bottom obstructed by a rotting trunk of a forest monarch that may have fallen more than a century before.

"Green is a tyrant in Kelantan. A native will cut out a garden plot in the jungle. By dint of industry he can keep the jungle back for two years' crops of tapioca root. Two years' abandonment results in a growth 10 feet high, impenetrable without an ax. Acres of Virginia farms abandoned during the Civil war support 30-foot pine trees, but one can still identify the old corn rows. Ten years after the Kelantan garden patch is sur-rendered, only the practiced eye can distinguish the spot from natural jungle.

"But not all of Kelantan is jungle. The plain in the northeast, one of the largest level regions in the whole peninsula, affords views where there are no trees to be seen for miles; only rice beds glistening like windows of an enormous hothouse and grass pastures for cattle. Even the disordered jungle is giving way to the ordered They expect to be out of touch with the world for two months.

rows of rubber trees. Rubber is now the most valuable export of Kelantan. Two other tree products, coconuts and betel nuts, figure heavily in its trade. Betel nuts are a chewing gum substitute of the Orient.

"Kelantan offers a handy example of the East Indies before and after European intervention. Kelantan has been made safer for the ordinary native citizen and his family and a greater share of the profits of the citizen's toil come to him,

"The native conception of municipal government can be understood best by imagining a parallel political system set up in an American corn-belt town. In the first place the mayor would regard the community solely as a source of wealth for himself although he would not live there but instead in Chicago. Neither would he take the responsibility for governing the town or collecting the taxes for himself since he could farm out that work to an exacting foreigner. In Kelantan the foreigner would be a Chinese.

a court in another city. Since the chief ends of justice, Kelantan style, are to support the judges, half the damages and costs, together with what terrorism, bribery and blackmail could exact, would go to these dignitaries Once in jail the citizen's chance of get ting out would be small indeed.

Friends Must Feed Prisoners. "It would be necessary to abandon the clean, well-kept jail of our hypo thetical Mid-West town to approach the old Kelantan standard. In a vacant lot there would be erected a high, solid-planked palisade. Inside there would be a double row of stout wooden cages about 30 inches from the wall and 6 inches off the ground. If the jail is crowded two persons can be put in one cage. Slats of the cell allow little light and air and there are no sanitary facilities. White men who have entered such compounds in Malay states tell that the stench is overpowering. The jail warden would be permitted by law to feed his prisoners with a half bushel of corn taken from every wagon entering town. None of the prisoners would ever get the corn. Unless relatives and friends fed them, a fee being charged for this by the warden, the prisoners would starve Indeed, in Kelantan many did starve to death.

Heavy Tax Burden.

"Continuing the parallel, the Mid-West citizen's tax bill would have to be greatly augmented. There would be the poll tax to raise a tribute to the capital. The mayor in addition would send a consignment of goods which the townsmen would have to buy whether they wished the goods or not and at an exorbitant price. At command they would have to leave their cornfields to the weeds to cut timber in the wood lots, float it down the river, surrender it to the authorities and receive no compensation. In addition, if the farmer should try to resist tyranny by abandoning his farm he would be fined for that.

"British intervention in Kelantan has wiped away most evils of this medieval system, which was far worse in practice than anything Europe ever knew in the blackest centuries of the Dark ages. Even the native ruler, who is still nominal head of the state, reigns in greater luxury, because he actually gets the taxes he levies although the British adviser has slashed the amount he may levy.

"Kelantan has railroad service with Bangkok and Singapore now. branch line came in from the north as far as the capital, Kota Bharu, Another finger line stretched toward it from the south. The fingers have joined and Kelantan's prosperity is assured for where the railroad goes in

JESUS HEALS AND SAVES A BLIND MAN

LESSON TEXT-John 9:1-41. GOLDEN TEXT—"I am the light of the world, he that followeth Me shall not walk in darkness, but shall have the light of life."—John 8:12. PRIMARY TOPIC—The Blind Man Made to Sea.

JUNIOR TOPIC-Jesus Helps a Blind Man.

I. Working the Works of While It Is Day (vv. 1-5).

1. The Disciples' Problem (vv. 1, 2). In their minds all affliction, negative and positive, was God's retribution for sin. Therefore, they argued that this man's blindness proved his sin. They recognized, too, that the effect of sin is sometimes hereditary. No doubt they inferred this from the second commandment (Ex. 20:5). The implication is that they held the view that men have a pre-existence, and that suffering in this life may be the result of sins committed in that pre-existent state. The Lord's Answer (vv. 3-5).

The Lord affirmed that in this case there was neither sin on the man's part, nor that of his parents, but that it was an occasion for the display of the works of God and that He had come to execute this task while it was day, because the night would come when no man could work. Since Christ s the light of the world, the task which challenged His attention was he opening of this man's eyes. purpose of Jesus in working miracles vas not a mere exhibition of miraculous power, but "to illustrate in the physical sphere His power in the spiritual sphere." This man's absolute helplessness in bettering his physical condition is illustrative of man's utter helplessness in the salvation of his own soul. The natural man is blind and dead (II Cor. 4:4; Eph. 2:1). God by His spirit must quicken the soul dead in trespasses and sin before it can see to take hold on Christ, the remedy for sin.

II. The Man's Eyes Opened (vv. 6, 7).

1. The Means.

Jesus spat on the ground and made clay of the spittle and anointed his eyes. Observe that the means used in this miracle were little less than foolish in themselves. The object must have been to teach this man the utter inadequacy of the means to the accomplishment of the end, that he might be caused to look from the means to the One who used them, that he might be convinced that the power was of

His Obedience (v. 7).

He immediately obeyed. He dld not stop to question the reasonableness of the command. Obedience only to that which seems reasonable is not obedience at all.

III. The Man's Testimony (vv. 8

In his testimony we have a fine example of the development of faith. The opening of this man's eyes aroused inquiry among his neighbors. When a man's spiritual eyes are opened, there will be a stir among his friends. 1. He Testified to His Personal Iden-

tity (v. 9). This was very easy. His self-consciousness enabled him to know that he was the same man who was born blind.

2. He Testified as to How It Was Done (vv. 11-15). So definite was his experience that he was able to tell just how it was done. When he repeated it there was no conflict.

3. He Testified That the One Who Opened His Eyes Was a Prophet (v. 17). 4. He Testified That This Healer No. Doubt Was Sent of God (vv. 30-33), He declared that He was the greatest worker of miracles who had appeared since the world began.

He worshiped Him as the Son of God (v. 38).

IV. The Results of His Confession 1. As to the People, They Were Divided in Sentiment (v. 16). Some believed He was from God because of His works, others that He was a sinner because He did His work on the Sabbath day.

2. As to the Man, They Cast Him Out (v. 34). Faithful testimony will often result in ostracism from even religious people.

3. As to Jesus, He Found the Man (v. 35). Being cast out by men he found himself in the arms of Jesus. It is quite often true that separation from human fellowship results in more vital fellowship with Jesus. He was led on to a deeper faith. He first saw Him as a miracle worker, then as a prophet and finally as the Son of God and when he perceived Him to be the Son of God, he worshiped Him.

Gold-Filled Elephant Tusk Found in Mining Claim

Seattle, Wash .- An authentic fossil tusk of the woolly elephant of the glacial or postgiacial period, with gold fillings like a modern tooth, has been presented to the museum of the University of Washington by Edward Squires, who discovered it on a mining claim on Dominion creek, 40 miles from Dawson, Yukon territory.
