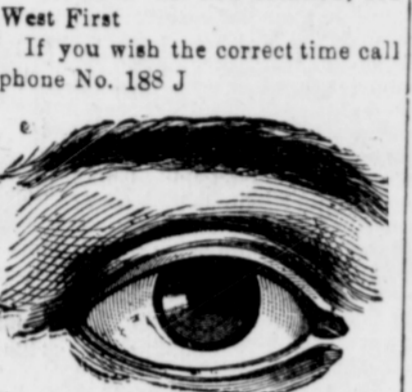

News Notes From All Over Oregon

Gleaned by the Western Newspaper Union for Busy People

To obtain funds for Pacific college at Newberg a campaign will be launched Thursday to raise \$100,000.

Thirteen men students now are quarantined in the University of Oregon infirmary at Eugene as a result of an epidemic of mumps.

The safe in the Southern Pacific station at West Fir, near Oakridge, was blown open and \$200 in cash taken.

Twenty-two persons met violent death in Portland in January, according to an official summary prepared by Coroner Smith.

Reservation of public lands in Coos county as public parks and camp sites was proposed in a bill introduced in the house by Representative Hawley.

Governor Pierce issued a requisition for the return of T. W. Lyle, who is wanted in Harney county on a forgery charge. Lyle was under arrest in Idaho.

William Cole and George Cabel, Columbia county prisoners, escaped from the jail at St. Helens after confederates on the outside had sawed away two bars.

Herbert Armstrong, of the Menasha Woodware company, North Bend, was chosen president of the Coos County Fire Patrol association at a meeting in Marshfield.

Under the direction of I. M. C. Anderson, county club agent, a series of meetings of the Boys' and Girls' clubs of Clackamas county are being held in various parts of the county.

The cement block Ferndale school, two miles north of Freewater, was gutted by fire. The building was erected in 1909 and it is estimated could not be replaced for less than \$20,000.

Mother of six children, although only 23 years of age, Mrs. Sylvia L. Fisher, wife of J. W. Fisher, died in a hospital at Bend after she took poison at her ranch house four miles east of that city.

An ultimatum to all poolrooms in Klamath Falls conducting punchboards and slot machines; to all gambling dives; to all bootlegging resorts, and to all disorderly houses to desist from unlawful activities was delivered by E. L. Elliott, district attorney.

As the first step in a program which contemplates the ultimate purchase by the city of Salem of the present water system, the council appropriated \$3500 to cover the expense of an appraisal of the property of the Salem Water, Light & Power company.

Senator Stanfield invited Governor Pierce to send a representative of Oregon to Washington, D. C., where a joint hearing before the senate and house public lands committees will be held Thursday to consider bills to confirm and quiet public land grants to the states.

Sisters, located at the east approach to the scenic McKenzie pass country, prepared for the coming tourist season by organizing the Sisters chamber of commerce. Dr. H. L. Vincent is president of the new organization.

William O. Crosby, known in central Oregon through his work in investigating the water holding possibilities of the Benham Falls storage reservoir site, died recently in Boston, friends in Bend have been notified.

The city council of McMinnville voted to hold an election on the question of including the college campus in the corporate limits of the city and of voting on the \$50,000 bonds for the \$500,000 building campaign of the college.

Thomas K. Campbell, public service commissioner, has been notified of his appointment to membership on the committee on express and other contract carriers and the special committee on uniform regulatory laws in the National Association of Railway and Utility commissioners.

Because the county must pay the fine money from arrests made on state highways by its traffic department into the state treasury, in accordance with the recently enacted law to that effect, the Wasco county court decided to economize and get along with but one speed cop in the future.

The public service commission authorized the Mount Hood Loop Railway company to reduce its rates on crude oil hauled from Rood River to Parkdale from 21 cents to 14 cents per 100 pounds. The reduction, it was said, will mean a saving of approximately \$55 per tank to the state highway department.

Closing of the Big and Little Nestucca rivers and the Nestucca bay, all in Tillamook county, were favored by resolutions adopted at a meeting of the Yamhill County Sportsmen's association at McMinnville. Mussolini Snarls at Germany

Anti-Italian Campaign Advocated in Bavaria Not to Be Tolerated.

Rome.—Premier Mussolini's speech in the chamber of deputies, in which he warned Germany against the anti-Italian campaign carried on in the reich, was characterized frequently in political circles as almost equivalent to a declaration of war against Germany.

The fateful words uttered by Mussolini in the thronged Italian chamber were an unmistakable warning to Germany, and had particular reference to a recent speech of Dr. Held, the militant Bavarian premier, who called upon all good Germans to help their fellow countrymen in southern Tyrol, now under Italian sovereignty by virtue of the treaty of St. Germain.

The climax of Mussolini's tirade against Germany came at the end, when he exclaimed: "Fascist Italy can if necessary, carry her flag beyond the Brennero frontier, but never backwards from where it flies now."

"To the German nation, we say, as we say to all peoples, the fascist people want to be your sincere friend, a friend by looking in your eye, a friend with your hands up, a good friend, but outside of 'kultur'."

"I wish I could be understood by all who should understand my words, so that the Italian government need not pass to a more concrete reply. This would be given tomorrow if the German government assumed responsibility for that which has happened and which may happen in Germany."

Burbank Says He is Healer.
Santa Rosa, Cal.—Power to cure the ill by the "laying on of hands," is claimed by Luther Burbank, plant wizard whose recent announcement regarding his views on religion caused a sensation. Burbank said he had demonstrated his power to heal in two or three hundred cases and could relate results "that would almost make your hair stand up."

Women Barred from Illinois Jury.
Springfield, Ill.—Women were definitely barred from jury service in Illinois when the state supreme court denied a rehearing in the suit brought against the jury commissioners of Cook county to have a woman's name reinstated on the jury list, from which it had been scratched.

Yelm Town Marshal Shot by Burglars.
Olympia, Wash.—C. R. Pake, aged 71 years, town marshal of Yelm, in eastern Thurston county, was shot five times and probably fatally injured while attempting to arrest two men whom he caught trying to break into the rear of a store.

Would Strengthen Law Enforcement

Bills Introduced to Create New Bureau and More Effectively Enforce Law.

Washington, D. C.—A complete overhauling of the federal prohibition machinery, reaching even to amendment of the Volstead act, is favored by the administration.

The first step in the administration's program was taken with the introduction of bills in the house and senate to create a new and independent prohibition bureau in the treasury.

A second administration measure, putting all except the highest enforcement officials under civil service regulations, was reported concurrently by a house committee.

In addition, it was disclosed that Secretary Mellon soon would recommend changes in the Volstead act to differentiate more clearly between major and minor violations.

The developments plunged the house into one of the bitterest prohibition debates in history and gave a foretaste of what may come when the whole subject is opened up for discussion. The debate, for a time, threatened to develop a flat fight.

It was made clear that the changes proposed do not contemplate modification of the basic provisions of the enforcement act in the sense of liberalization to permit production and sale of alcoholic liquors. Mr. Mellon's program, it was emphasized, deals entirely with the machinery by which the dry law is enforced.

Soviet Gems Are in Demand.
Moscow.—Gem experts of seven nationalities are contending for possession of part of the famous Romanoff crown jewels, which the soviet government has placed on the market. Americans are the most active bidders, closely followed by French and British experts.

Oregon State Bank Assets Increase.
Portland, Or.—State banks and trust companies of Oregon increased their assets \$14,000,000, their deposits by a like amount and there were only two failures of state banking institutions in 1925, according to the report of the state superintendent of banks.
