Proceedings were filed in the circuit court at Salem against Sam A. Kozer, secretary of state, to enjoin him from placing on the ballot at the November election an initiative measure prohibiting the use of fish wheels and seines in the Columbia river east of the Cascade mountains.

> The state treasurer has advised William Levens, state prohibition director, that the prohibition department has received \$50,000 this year, which is the maximum amount allowed annually from fines collected by the counties for prohibition violations. The prohibition department now has approximately \$30,000 to operate on during the remainder of this year.

There were three fatalities in Oregon due to industrial accidents during the week ending July 15, according to a report prepared by the state industrial accident commission. The victims were Fred Petersteiner, Bray Hill, planer feeder; George E. Bairey, Salem, driver, and Edgar S. Berry, Vernonia, undecker. A total of 857 accidents was reported during the

Frederick L. Miller, Portland jeweler, filed an appeal in the United States supreme court in which he challenges the section of the Oregon automobile law under which he was convicted of manslaughter in connection with the death of Mrs. Alma Hall in Multnomah county. Miller contends the law is unconstitutional and the indictment

Production of lumber for more than 100 Pacific coast sawmills decreased from 114,118,688 feet for the week ended June 26 to 73,152,430 feet for the week ended July 10, according to the weekly report of production, orders and shipments, issued by the West Coast Lumbermen's association. New business fell from 124,588,686 feet to 77,173,405 feet for the same period and shipments decreased from 117,433,950 feet to 74,876,094 feet.

Officials having supervision over the tax rolls in the 18 Oregon counties which will benefit from the advance of tax money on the Oregon and California grant lands have been requested by Senator Stanfield to prepare the billings which they will present to the interior department, beginning the work by bringing the rolls up to date from 1915, when the last payments to the counties on the O & C. lands were made under the Chamberlain-Ferris act.

It will require approximately \$2. 000,000 in addition to funds now obligated under the state bonus law to comply with the recent ruling of the state supreme court that members of the student army training corps were members of the United States army during the world war and are entitled to benefits under the loan provision of the act. It was estimated that more than 1000 members of the student army training corps would be eligible for loans under the state rellef act.
