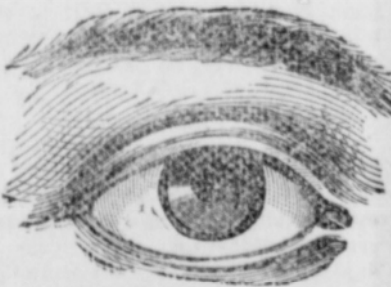

**Statewide News Items**

have all increased 10 per cent within the past 12 months.

One hundred thousand boxes, the largest crop yielded in its history, is the estimate orchardists have placed on this year's crop at the Modoc orchard, one of the largest pear orchards in the world, located 12 miles north of Medford in the Table rock district.

The assessors of the Oregon and California land grant counties met in Eugene Saturday to discuss questions pertaining to the carrying out of the measure which was passed by congress a short time ago, refunding several years' taxes on the grant lands to the counties.

Citizens of Newport and Lincoln county are discussing the announcement made by a corporation representative that the Siletz river is to be harnessed, a hydro-electric plant built, electric power furnished to operate a pulp mill and water to be brought to Toledo and Newport to supply both cities.

The surveying crew working on the proposed Wilson river road to the coast under the supervision of C. R. Burns, state highway commission engineer, has completed work on the east side and has moved to the Tillamook side to take up the survey where it was left off in the fall. The survey is expected to be completed in six weeks.

Reports at Salem indicate that members of the public service commission are considering the issuance of an order citing the several railroads involved in the proposed central Oregon railway development to appear before the commission and show cause why they have not complied with the recent order of the interstate commerce commission.

Protection as a watershed for the city of Bend, of approximately 6000 acres of national forest land tributary to the south fork of the Tumalo creek will be provided in an agreement which will be signed by Mayor Fox and Recorder Bennett and then sent to Secretary of Agriculture Pardini for his signature. The city agrees to cooperate in patrolling the area.

The convictions of W. Harrison Whitaker and George L. Jennings, arrested in Multnomah county charged with selling so-called "units of interest" in an electrical device intended for the extraction of gold from the waters of Mono Lake, California, without first obtaining a permit from the state corporation department, were affirmed by the state supreme court.

That the state highway commission intends to ask soon for bids on construction of the Roosevelt highway between the Siuslaw and Umpqua rivers through portions of Lane and Douglas counties, is the belief of Lane county officials, who have been informed that a crew of state highway engineers is now working on a survey south of Glenada, on the south bank of the Siuslaw.

Bids for \$40,000 worth of highway bonds were authorized by the special commission in charge of constructing the short-cut road through the Salmon river country to Otis, where 28 miles of highway will be eliminated on the road to northern Lincoln county. The commission will open the bids at its next meeting, August 4. Grading probably will start within ten days after the bonds are sold.

The water shortage in eastern and central Oregon, with the exception of districts having prior rights to the natural flows, is more serious at the present time than for many years, according to reports received at the offices of the state engineer. The most serious shortage of water for crops was reported by the Crook county improvement district and the Arnold Irrigation company, both of which are in central Oregon.

Reclamation Commissioner Mead is authority for the statement that activity will begin in the very near future on both the Owyhee and the Vale irrigation projects, with limited funds that are available. A contract soon will be let for building a road to the proposed dam site on the Malheur river, and the cost of this road, together with sums that will be paid out for lands needed for rights of way for the reservoir site canals and other works will exhaust the present appropriation for the Owyhee. About half the recent appropriation for the Vale project will be paid out for a full half interest in the Warm Springs reservoir, and the remainder of that appropriation will be spent on drainage work which is a necessary preliminary and for locating the main canal.
