## GOVERNMENT HAS NEW ANTI-BOOZE WEAPON

Taxes and Penalties to Be Assessed Against Liquor Manufacturers and Others.

Washington, D. C. — The government's new weapon against illicit liquor—taxation—has been ordered into operation by the treasury.

Instructions were issued to prohibition administrators regarding the form of taxes and penalties which may be assessed against liquor manufacturers and others under the new revenue law and the prohibition act. Just how the liquor is to be traced back to the manufacturers and proof of their liability established is not clear, but 62 "assessors" have been added to the staff for that work.

The instructions issued to prohibition administrators point out that double and triple taxes on illicit liquor can be assessed as penalties.

Under the new revenue law the tax is \$6.40 a proof gallon on all distilled spirits diverted to beverage use and \$5 a barrel on beer containing more than one-half of 1 per cent of alcohol sold for beverage consumption. A special tax of \$1000 is levied on any person carrying on the business of a brewer, distiller, wholesale liquor dealer, retail liquor dealer or manufacturer of stills.

All of these assessments are in addition to the regular stamp taxes which are required under the revenue law on all distilled liquor, wine and beer. Most of the new staff of 62 assessors will be assigned to deputy internal revenue collectors and will work with the federal district attorney.

### Mellon Admits Finance Mission.

London.—President Coolidge has instructed Secretary of the Treasury Mellon to establish connections with various European governments and open discussions with them on the prevalent finance situation in Europe, according to the Geneva correspondent of the Central News.

In all statements which Secretary Mellon has made heretofore he has insisted that he is in Europe only on a vacation.

### Jacobs Jury Unable to Agree.

Olympia, Wash.—Unable to reach an agreement after they had had the case 24 hours, the jury before which Roy Jacobs was tried for the murder of C. R. Pake, night marshal of Yelm, was discharged.

Petitions for an initiative measure looking to the regulation of fishing in the Columbia river east of Cascade Locks are sufficient, according to an opinion prepared by Judge McMahan of the Marion county circuit court. Suit was brought by the state of Oregon, on relation of John H. Carson, district attorney, to enjoin the secretary of state from placing the measure on the ballot at the November election.

## Statewide News Items

highway about 17 miles west of Junction City.

Eight firemen were injured, one seriously, three were overcome by smoke, and damage in excess of \$100,000 was done when fire swept three floors of a brick building occupied by the Pacific Stationery & Printing company in Portland.

The public service commission denied a petition filed by residents of Lane county asking that the application of the Southern Pacific company for permission to substitute busses for street cars on the Eugene-Springfield line be rejected.

The Oregon hunter will find a great number of birds next fall when the season is open October 17 to 24, according to F. M. Brown, chief deputy state game warden. Chinese pheasants and grouse will be particularly plentiful, Brown reported.

Threshing of fall grain is virtually completed in the Harrisburg district and the outfits have gone right into the spring grain threshing. Fall wheat was the poorest it has been for several seasons, averaging only about 12 or 15 bushels to the acre.

Production of lumber by 104 West Coast Lumbermen's association mills was nearly 2,000,000 less for the week ended July 24, compared to the week previous. There was a decrease of more than 5,000,000 feet of new orders booked, and a decrease of more than 8,000,000 feet in shipments.

Dates of the various county teachers' institutes to be held in Oregon this year have been fixed tentatively by R. R. Turner, state superintendent of schools. The first will be held in Klamath Falls, starting September 2. The institutes will continue during the greater part of September and October.

To settle the question of whether or not the boundaries of Crater national park shall be extended to include Diamond lake, noted fishing resort, President Coolidge's co-ordinating committee on parks and forests will arrive in Klamath Falls Wednesday and journey to Diamond lake to hold a hearing.

Portland milling interests won a victory when the interstate commerce commission, on complaint of the Crown Mills against the Northern Pacific and other carriers, decreed that Portland mills are entitled to reach Puget sound markets on the same basis as their sound competitors now reach Portland.

Suit was filed in the circuit court at Salem by the Pacific Outfitting company and the Eastern Outfitting company with branch stores in Portland to restrain the state tax commission from collecting income tax for the year 1923 aggregating \$7800. Of this amount the state alleges that the first owes \$5600 and the latter \$2200.

School district No. 55, Malheur county, has authority under the law to use its school funds for the transportation of its five pupils to another district or provide them with board and lodging at any place the school officials may select to send them to school, according to an opinion prepared by the attorney-general. School district No. 55 is located 65 miles from the nearest high school.

Initiative petitions filed with the secretary of state in support of the so-called hydro-electric development measure sponsored by the Housewives' council of Portland, contained a sufficient number of signatures of legal voters to warrant the measure being placed on the ballot at the general election in November, according to an opinion handed down by the state supreme court.
