BRIEF GENERAL NEWS

The provisional commercial accord just concluded by France and Germany ends what has amounted to a sporadic tariff.

American exports of textile commodities declined in value nearly 12 per cent during the fiscal year ended July 30.

Charles Curtis was renominated for United States senator in the Kansas republican primaries by at least 125,000 votes.

Horse racing under the pari-mutuel betting system is not a game of chance and is therefore permitted under the state law and constitution of Utah, the state supreme court held.

The state of Washington, in 1925, produced gold, silver, copper, lead and zinc to the value of \$1,092,464, compared with an output of \$948,490 in 1924, according to figures published by the United States geological survey.

Dispatches from Angora, the Turkish capital, say the government has ordered the closing of all foreign chambers of commerce in the country. The order is said to be directed particularly at the American, British, French and Italian chambers.

Brazil to Stay Out of Arms Conclave.

London.—Brazil has formally notified the League of Nations of her decision not to participate further in the work of the disarmament commission of the league, according to a dispatch from Geneva.

**WHITE PINE BELT
 SWEEP BY FLAMES**

Fire Raging in Dry Woods in Spokane Vicinity and in Northern Idaho.

Spokane, Wash.—Forest fires swept the white pine belt of Northern Idaho and the Spokane territory, devastating 170,000 acres of federal forestry acreage, 50,000 acres of adjoining forests and an estimate of 75,000 to 100,000 private lands within 100 miles of this city.

High winds played havoc with the thousands of fire fighters, and smoke hanging low over this entire district has made airplane reconnoitering valueless to those in charge in the field.

The tragedy of the situation is in the large number of incendiary fires reported at every hand. A former inmate of the state insane asylum is charged with setting 11 fires last week in the Colville district north of Spokane.

The woods are like tinder and fire spreads more rapidly due to the humidity conditions than in any previous year. Damage in July alone was four times greater than in the combined past two years, with Howard Flint, federal district fire inspector, characterizing the general situation as being "so bad it couldn't be any worse" because of burned telephone and telegraph lines and the intense centralization on the protection of small towns, mills, mines and farm houses.

**GERTRUDE EDERLE
 SWIMS CHANNEL**

Kingsdown, England. — Gertrude Ederle of New York swam across the English channel—a stretch of water which in all recorded history never had before been conquered by a woman.

Gertrude stepped ashore here exactly 14 hours and a half after entering the water at Capa Gris Nez.

Gertrude not only was the first woman to swim the English channel but she accomplished the swim in almost two hours less time than was required by the fastest man who ever swam across—Sebastian Tiraboschi—who required 16 hours and 23 minutes to accomplish the swim on August 11-12, 1923.

The American girl's success came on her second attempt in two seasons. After a remarkable exhibition of speed and endurance in her attempt to swim the channel last year, Gertrude abandoned the trial after eight hours and a half, beaten by rough water off the Goodwin sands.

SOVIET FLEET IN REBELLION

Rumored Trotsky is Fugitive and Mobilization Ordered.

Bucharest, Roumania. — Reports of an alleged insurrection in Russia continued to reach the newspapers here.

The latest of these are to the effect that the soviet fleet has gone over to Gregory Zinovieff and is attacking the Southern littoral and that Zinovieff has been wounded and that Leon Trotsky is a fugitive.

It is further rumored that the soviet has ordered a general mobilization.

Although there are neither details nor corroboration of these reports from authoritative sources, their persistency has led to the belief in some quarters here that there is a serious situation in Russia.

the Deschutes watershed is serious.

Aggregate bank deposits in Oregon on June 30, 1926, were approximately \$2,000,000 greater than ever reported in history of the state, according to the financial report of Frank C. Bramwell, state superintendent of banks.

Bend is to be the host to sheep men of Oregon this fall, when the annual convention of the Oregon Wool Growers' association will be held there. October 9 and 10 have been selected as tentative dates for the 1926 convention.

Briefs in support of the application for a rehearing of the case of James Willos and Ellsworth Kelly, convicts who are awaiting execution for the part they played in the prison break at Salem on August 12 of last year have been filed in the state supreme court.

A cache containing over 200 cases of choice wine, gin and bonded whiskey, valued at \$18,000, was discovered by Jim Derrick and Ord Castle, Lincoln county engineers, under some brush along the beach about two miles above Otter rock in Lincoln county.

Because of the extreme dryness, a tract of 23,000 acres in the Mount Hood national forest has been ordered closed. The area extends from the Clackamas river to the Hillockburn road, and covers the watershed of the south fork of the Clackamas river and its tributaries.

Reduction of rates charged by the Pacific Telephone and Telegraph company in the state of Oregon will be sought in proceedings to be filed by Governor Pierce with the public service commission, according to announcement made at the executive department at Salem.

Official driving of the last spike on the Eugene-Klamath Falls cut-off of the Southern Pacific took place near the summit of the Cascade mountains Saturday. The wedding of "Miss Eugene" to "Mr. Klamath Falls" took place at that time with a mock marriage ceremony.

Work in straightening the Umatilla river channel for 200 yards above the new \$24,000 concrete bridge at Echo is under way. Silt, sand and gravel accumulating around the piles under the old bridge threaten to change the course of the river and leave the new span high and dry.

Notable gains were made last week by mills reporting to the West Coast Lumbermen's association in production, new orders booked and shipments made. Production last week totaled 109,312,646 feet, new orders were booked for 114,197,486 feet and shipments made totaled 110,990,975 feet.

With lavish ceremonies, in which more than 1000 Indians participated, Modoc Charlie, 76, blind tribal counselor for the Klamath Indian tribes, was buried following a funeral service which lasted for 48 hours without intermission, and at which nearly \$4000 worth of food was consumed.

Because of the great number of incendiary forest fires, the Douglas county court has offered a reward of \$500 for the apprehension and conviction of any person starting a forest fire within the county. Since the middle of July there have been more than 125 fires reported as being incendiary.

Diamond lake will not be included in Crater Lake National park. The president's co-ordinating commission, which had been for four days considering and holding public hearings on the question of extending park boundaries northward to take in the famous fishing resort, following a brief hearing at Medford, voted unanimously to recommend that Diamond lake remain under forest service jurisdiction.

Concrete paving and parapet wall at MacKay dam has been completed and with this work the construction work at MacKay dam is rapidly being brought to a close after three years has been used by the reclamation service in building the dam, which will store 172,000 acre feet of water from MacKay creek to be used each year in furnishing water to the Hermiston-Stanfield and Butter creek regions.

Max G. Cohen, who prior to August, 1913, was a police magistrate in Portland, and who was convicted of subordination of perjury there and sentenced to federal prison, only to be pardoned and fully restored to citizenship again by the late President Wilson, was convicted of the same crime in the southern district United States court and sentenced to serve 18 months in the government penitentiary at Atlanta.

U. P. to Ban Women Workers.

Omaha, Neb.—Women will be ineligible for employment by the Union Pacific railroad, according to orders issued by W. M. Jeffers, general manager of the road. Women now employed by the road will not be affected by the order, but no more will be hired, it was announced.
