SPORT INTEREST REVIVED BY PAGE

Indiana Athletics Expected to Show Upward Trend.

With Pat Page as head football coach, athletics at the University of Indiana are expected to show a decided trend upward. Page won his spurs as an athlete at the University of Chicago and there first attracted attention as a coach of above average ability.

After serving at Chicago as an assistant to Alonzo Stagg on the football field and as head coach of the basketball team, he received a call from Butler college in Indiana. At that time he was directing the basketball team and had developed the five-man defense to a high scale, the first coach in the Big Ten to make use of this type of play.

Butler college was unknown athletically, but Page decided to leave Chicago, and for the last seven years he has been at Butler in charge of all athletics. As had been expected, his basketball teams were almost unbeatable but his football teams, a sport in which he was not expected to excel as a coach, proved powerful and versatile, ranking with his basketball quintets. He tried his hand at baseball and while his nines did not compare in winning power with his basketball and football teams, it was quite evident that he had done well with the limited material.

At Indiana, where the football elevens have been near the bottom of the Big Ten standing in recent years, it is expected that Page will devote the major part of his time to the gridiron sport, but it is hardly likely that Indiana officials will overlook his ability as a court coach.

Sore Arm Paved Way to Renown for the Bambino

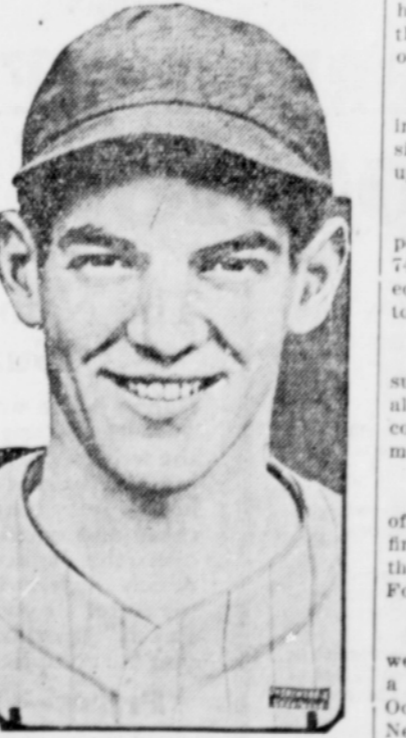
Adversity paved the way to the greatest home-run hitting record of all time, Babe Ruth has revealed.

"In the spring of 1919," explains Babe, whose fame as a southpaw moundsman preceded his feats as a long-range hitter, "I developed a sore arm. I didn't know when I'd be able to pitch again and I didn't want to sit around and do nothing. So I told Ed Barrow, who was managing the Red Sox at that time, that I'd like to play the outfield."

"Ed told me I could—you know the rest."

The change became a permanent one. Ruth entered upon his career as a slugger and soon became such a sensation on the diamond that Barrow could not afford to remove him from the outfield.

Ellison joined the Seals as player in 1921, going there from the Detroit Tigers. As soon as Ellison resigned, the club appointed Richard Williams, a veteran, who has been handling the Logan team of the Utah-Idaho league. Williams has been in baseball for 25 years.
