## WOOD Superior Circulator



The Wood Superior Circulator is made like a warm air furnace. The inside stove is constructed similar to our well-known Wood Superior, but has in addition an outer casing which forms the circulating flues. Here it becomes highly heated and is pushed upward and out through the fret work top, thus causing a constant circulation of all the air in the room or house, quickly resulting in even temperature throughout.

The Wood Superior Circulator is provided with a water pan, enamelled inside, which is attached to the back casing and is large enough to afford a satisfactory degree of moist air, owing to its large evaporating surface.
