Three Married Women



Women in U. S. Treasury The assistant treasurer of the United States informs us that in the spring of 1862 Mr. F. E. This work was then done with shears in the hands of men. He appointed Miss Jennie Douglas, and, as he afterward expressed it, "her first day's work settled the matter in her and in woman's favor." On October 9, 1862, the following woman employees were appointed: Miss Fannie L. Halstead, Miss Annie York, Miss Belle S. Tracy, Miss Elizabeth Stoner and Miss Mary Burke. Hay Cafeteria Service



Our hay crop furnishes one of the largest cafeteria services in existence,

according to the Sears-Roebuck Agricultural Foundation. Seventy-eight million tons, it is expected, will be produced in 1926, a large part of which will be consumed by cattle. According to figures put out by the Department of Agriculture, 51.4% of this amount will be eaten by cattle, 44.6% by horses and the remaining 3.8% by sheep. The amount of hay eaten by hogs is very slight, only a small fraction of one per cent of the alfalfa crop. As in the case of other feed crops, most of this hay is consumed right on the farm where it is
