Panney's Prize Guernseys at International Live Stock Show

Thirty-one of the finest "Foremost Guernsey" cattle belonging to Mr. J. C. Penney, owner of the Enmadine Farm, Hopewell Junction, N. Y., and founder of the J. C. Penney Company, were on exhibit on all last week at the Pacific International Live Stock Exhibition at Portland. This is a part of the only endowed herd of cattle in the world, for the perpetuation of which Mr. Penney has set aside a considerable sum of money in the interest of scientific breeding. Wherever exhibited, "Foremost Guernseys" have lived up to their name.

They have to their credit so far this year 214 prizes taken at various state and interstate fairs. This number includes ten grand championship prizes, fifteen championships, sixty-two first prizes and many special trophies.

At the National Dairy Show at Memphis, this fall, Mr. Penney was awarded the Peer Challenge Cup, which together with receiving first prize on his undefeated Get-of-Sire, gives Mr. Penney the distinction of being the Premier Breeder of Guernsey cattle this year.

This is the first year that this famous herd has been exhibited West of Chicago. The showing at Portland this year was in response to repeated requests from western breeders and dairymen, and aroused much interest in view of the fact that Mr. Penney was premier Guernsey exhibitor at the National Dairy Show for three consecutive years, 1924 25 26.

It is interesting to note that while this is the first year that the Peer Challenge cup has gone East, that Mr. Penney was born and reared in Missouri and founded in Wyoming his original store from which has grown the present organization of 885 department stores bearing his name.

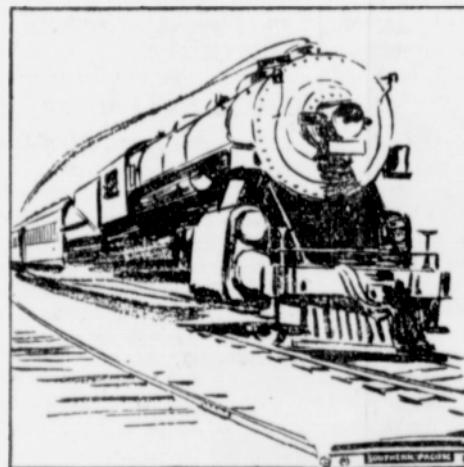
