Something practical, equitable and helpful in the way of farm re lief is now in prospect, several forces not heretofore in harmony having come pretty close together in recent reports and recommendations. The latest expression on the subject comes from the "Business. men's Commission on Agriculture' whose chairman is Charles Nagel of St. Louis, who was secretary of agriculture in President Taft's cabinet, and the significant fact is that all the differing factions have received Mr. Nagel's recommendations favorably. This plan provides for a federal farm board, as in other plans, and that this board shall be authorized to buy stock in the "equalization corporation" and be represented in that corporation by directors, the intention being to buy and hold surplus products when the markets are depressed and to dispose of them when stability is restored. Losses from these transactions must be absorbed from the public treasury.
