Explaining the government policy of grazing permits, the assistant forester in charge of the range management says that each settler or resident is entitled to graze ten head of his domestic stock, such as work or saddle horses, milk cows, and even hogs free of charge and without a permit on national forest ranges. All other animals to be paid for at a rate which at the present averages between ten and eleven cents per head per month for cattle and three cents per head per month for sheep.

Paying on an average on the cooperative basis of 2 cents above the market price of butterfat, the Linn County Cooperative Creamery Association paid to its patrons last year \$270,778 for butterfat. Eggs brought the farmers an additional \$48,270. Besides a good market for these products the association has been instrumental in greatly increasing the more profitable cow and hen as well as building up one of the best industries in the county.
