

**Ohio Schools Take Interest in Public Utility Study Courses**

Three institutions of higher learning in Ohio have established courses in public utilities. In addition to those institutions there are eight other Ohio colleges and universities which touch upon various phases of the public utility industry, such as utility financing, regulation and management.

A recent survey shows that Ohio State University has separate courses in public utility management, public utility financing and public utility regulation, while Miami University at Oxford, has courses in public utility financing and regulation, and Mt. Union College at Alliance has a course in public utility management.

Akron municipal university touches upon public utility financing in its general financial course and upon public utility regulation in its course in business and government.
