Fay Githens attended the U Go I Go club at the home of Mrs. Laura Abraham Wednesday afternoon.

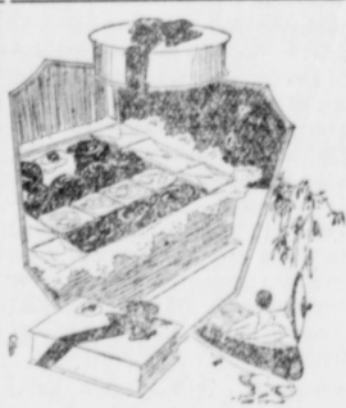
