HOMEcoming AT O.S.C. BIDS FAIR TO BE A WARM EVENT

This city, known as the "heart of the valley," is going to be the heart of Oregon for at least one day, judging from the unprecedented interest in the annual Homecoming celebration at the Oregon State college November 16 and 17, the central feature of which is the big football classic between the college and university.

Not only are alumni of both institutions reported coming in record breaking numbers, but interest among others has mounted to such a pitch that some communities such as Tillamook will move on the campus in caravan formation. The cheese center of the state -- or one of them, (Coos Bay please note) sends word that an auto caravan of some 70 cars will leave there behind a convoy of state traffic officers.

Official opening of the new \$500,000 memorial union building is another major event of Homecoming this year which is attracting

wide attention as thousands of students, alumni, faculty and other friends contributed to the cost.

Scores of the past Oregon-Oregon State games reveal that the Webfoots have triumphed in 18 of the 32 turf-massaging affairs between the two schools. The Orange men have been victorious on eight occasions and six times the two elevens have been deadlocked at the end of the game. The coming of Schissler in 1924 produced a decided change in the relative status of the two elevens, however. Since that time the Orangemen have emerged on the long end of the score three times out of four.

Both squads will present nearly their full battle strength when they tangle here November 17. Carl Metten, State half, may be out of the picture on that afternoon but otherwise the situation is most encouraging here. The Webfoots are also dining on raw meat and will be primed for the game according to stories from the Eugene camp.
