A Farm Boys' Advice

"Only in union is there strength and the farmers must cooperate in the marketing of their products if they intend to advance and prosper," says Russell Walter Clinton, in his prize essay in a south-wide contest, by the American Cotton Growers' Exchange in which about 10,000 boys and girls participated. The subject of all the essays was, "Cooperative marketing as it affects the cotton farmer."

The finals in the contest were held at Montgomery, Alabama, where state champions competed for the four medals and cash prizes.

The advice given by young Walters applies with equal force to all farmers, whether they raise cotton or some other crop. While much progress in cooperative marketing has been made in recent years, the movement is yet in its infancy. An extension of the practice to all farmers would go a long way toward solving one of the most important problems of agriculture.

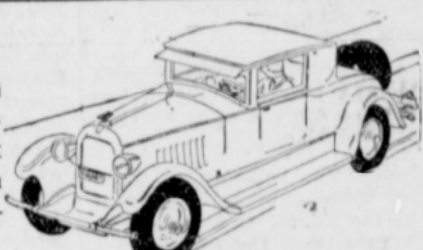

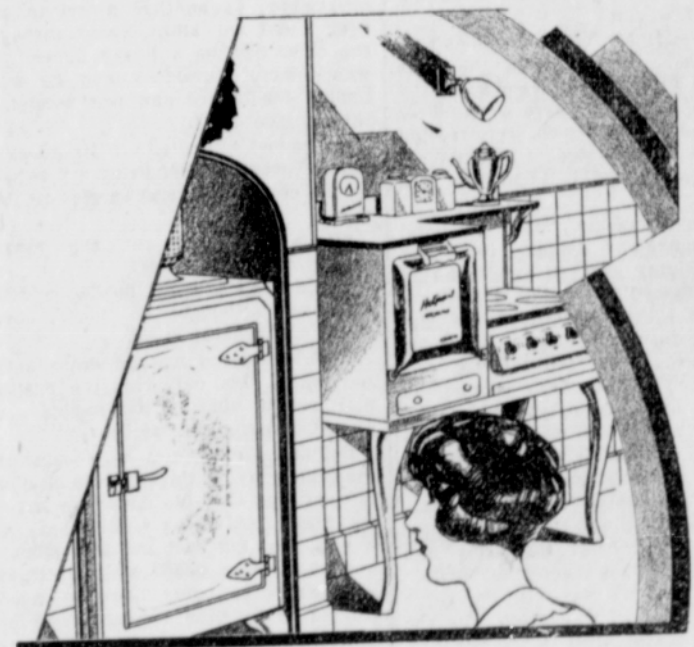
