After serving as president of the Farmers' Union of America for 22 years, Charles S. Barrett of Union City, Ga., has voluntarily retired from that office. In a farewell address to the national convention of the organization he urged the farmers not to depend too much upon political promises, but to try to work out their own problems. Reviewing some of the accomplishments of the Farmers' Union, he declared that it is now successfully operating many cooperative businesses. Calling upon the farmers to

further unite for mutual protection he declared that to be the only way to accomplish their purpose.

Every intelligent radio fan must be impressed with the fact that the air is cluttered up with a lot of inferior programs which might as well be dispensed with in the interest of real satisfaction to listeners. "The utilities have not nearly reached the limit of their usefulness to the public," said Mr. John J. O'Brien, president of H. M. Byllesby and Company. of electric service to rural communities and farms."

Led by the National Federation of Women's clubs, which in 1926 declared war on billboards which mar the beauty of rural scenery, numerous other organizations have joined in the fight to restrict outdoor advertising which in recent years has become increasingly offensive.

Recent advertisements by one of the big tobacco companies have caused resentment among manufacturers of candies and other confections who threaten reprisals in case the offensive advertising is not discontinued.

The vegetable holly wreath is one of these dishes which appeals to the eye as well as to the palate, for its green and red make it festive

Did you ever consider your Christmas dinner in the light of a gift to your family? And yet that is what you actually offer them when you serve your Christmas feast, to see to it that you, yourself, are not so tired that they cannot have the best of you, too!

The secret of preparing a Christmas dinner which will be enjoyed by everyone, you included, is to plan it so that many of the foods may be prepared beforehand; also plan to serve one or two dishes which are unusually attractive looking. Such is the vegetable holly wreath described below.

To make the Christmas appetizer, toast a circle of bread. Spread with contents of a can of sardines mixed with enough creamed butter to mix them to a smooth paste. Season with salt, red pepper and lemon juice. On top put a slice of hard boiled egg liberally sprinkled with grated parsley. Across this put a narrow band of canned pimiento to make the red and green coloring.

Good Things to Eat  
Consommé with oysters has a

much more interesting effect than plain consommé and yet it is not really filling. To make it, heat the consommé from two cans and two cups of water to boiling. Heat a five ounce can of oysters in their own liquor, bringing just to the boiling point. Add to the broth, season with celery salt and salt to taste.

An unusual combination consists of Brussels sprouts and chestnuts, but it is one which will be acclaimed with joy. Drain the liquid from a number 2 can of Brussels sprouts (save the liquid for soup) and sauté the sprouts gently in two tablespoons of butter for about five minutes. Boil one cup of shelled chestnuts until tender, remove skins and sauté them in two teaspoons of butter and two teaspoons of sugar until brown. Combine with the

looking. Heat one can of spinach or beet greens, season with lemon juice, butter, salt and pepper to taste. Pack tightly in a greased ring mold and set in a steamer to keep hot. Heat one can of tiny rosebud beets and season with butter, salt and pepper. When ready to serve, turn the ring mold of spinach out onto a hot, round, platter and pile beets in the center.

The salad provides a cool, crisp flavor to contrast with the richness of the goose and other foods. Drain and chill one number 2 can of grapefruit and one cup seeded white grapes. Make a French dressing using grapefruit juice instead of vinegar. Arrange the fruit on lettuce hearts and pour over dressing. Garnish each salad with a star cut out of pimiento and placed inside a ring of green pepper.

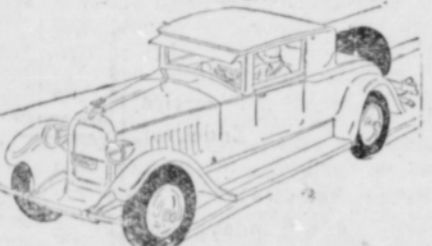
