

Corn Combinations



CORN all by itself is warm in color and delicious in taste. But corn can be cunningly combined with fish, meat and other vegetables so as to retain all its own succulent flavor and also give an additional fillip to the appetite by intriguing the palate with the flavors of other foods. For instance, there is:

Corn and Salmon Pudding: Mix in the following order, contents of one number 2 can of corn, one tablespoon melted butter, one-half teaspoon salt, one-eighth teaspoon pepper, one small can salmon and one tablespoon heavy cream or evaporated milk. Bake in a buttered baking dish in a moderate oven, 350°, for thirty minutes. This will serve from six to eight.

With Meats and Vegetables
Hamburg and Corn Scramble:

Sauté one medium chopped onion in two tablespoons of butter a few minutes, add three-quarters of a pound of Hamburg steak, and stir until well browned. Add one number 2 can corn, two teaspoons salt and one-fourth teaspoon pepper, and heat. This, too, will serve from six to eight people.

Escalloped Corn and Eggplant: Chop coarsely one green pepper and two pimientos and sauté them with one-half a medium eggplant, diced, (about three cups) in three tablespoons butter until slightly brown. Add one number 2 can corn, one cup thin cream or rich milk, two teaspoons salt, one-fourth teaspoon pepper and one-fourth teaspoon celery salt, and pour into a buttered casserole. Cover with buttered crumbs, and bake, covered. Remove cover at the last to brown the crumbs. This will serve from four to six people.
