WHO? Single persons who
had net income of \$1,000 or

VALUABLE HOUSEHOLD RECIPES AND SUGGESTIONS

Cinnamon Rolls—Into 3 coffee
cups of risen bread dough work
a piece of butter the size of a
large egg, and set to rise again.
When light roll out less than
half an inch thick, spread with
butter, sprinkle thickly with
powdered sugar and a teaspoon-
ful of cinnamon. Roll up into
an oblong roll, and slice down
from the end in slices an inch
and a half thick. Place in a tin
and bake when light.

Spice Cake—Take a teaspoon
of butter, two pounds of brown
sugar, and three eggs; beat al-
together, then add a half a cup
of sour milk with a teaspoonful
of soda in it, two teaspoonfuls
each of ground cloves, cinnamon
and allspice, a little grated nut-
meg, then two and two-thirds
cups of flour, last of all two
cups of cropped raisins. Bake
in a slow oven. If the raisins
are put in the cake the last thing
and stirred only just enough to
mix, they will not fall to the
bottom of the cake.

Brown Bread—Seven cups
of milk (three sweet and four
sour), five cups of fine corn
meal, two cups of flour, three
heaping teaspoonfuls of salt, 5
tablespoonfuls of molasses. Put
all the small items in the milk,
then add the meal and flour,
stirring slowly. Steam four
hours and bake brown. This
will make a large loaf.

French Rolls—One pint of
milk, bring to a boiling heat,
add two tablespoonfuls sugar,
a little butter and a little salt.
Stir in as much flour as possi-
ble but do not knead. When
sufficiently cool add one-half
cup of yeast. When risen, roll
flour the hands and board, roll
one-half as thick as biscuit,
spread with butter, cut with a
large cutter, fold together, let
rise, and bake quickly. To be
eaten hot.

HOUSEHOLD HINTS

An adequate meal for any
body—whole wheat bread and
milk.

Plan home meals around a bot-
tle of milk instead of a pound
of sugar.

Sandpaper and an ordinary
blackboard eraser will keep the
kitchen stove clean with little
effort.

A white sauce is the founda-
tion of half the recipes in any
cookbook. Learn how to make
a perfect white sauce.

Keep sandwiches fresh by
wrapping in a dry napkin, then
in cloth wrung out of cold water
and put either in the refrigerator
or iceless cooler.

Add a pinch of soda to stewed
rhubarb, dried apricots, or
cranberries when nearly done
and considerably less sugar will
be required for sweetening.

When tablecloths show wear
along the creases it is well to
cut an inch from one side and
one end of the cloth and re-
finish the edges. This will bring
all of the creases in a new place.

A ten minute dessert: Put
any canned fruit with plenty of
juice in a stewpan and heat.
Drop spoonfuls of dumpling
batter on top of the fruit, cover,
and cook ten minutes. Serve
the dumplings with stewed fruit
as a sauce.

FARM REMINDERS

Two vegetable crops a year
and use of cover crops to main-
tain soils in physical and fer-
tility conditions, are advan-
tages of irrigating the vegeta-
ble garden. Quality and
size are improved by water at
the right time. It will enable
the growing of one crop at
least not in competition with
general growers, insuring a
good market. Irrigation crops
hit the market both earlier
and later than unwatered
crops.

Three types of insect and
disease pest remedies are often
hawked about Oregon farms
endangering real control. One
type of these fake panaceas is
merely harmless, having power
neither for good nor bad, one
is actually dangerous to the
crop it is said to protect, and
the third is largely ineffective

because the remedy is not in
suitable form for the designed
use, and is high priced.

Egg size and shape are in-
fluenced. Gradual selection of
those birds which in addition
to a large number also lay
"selects" will in time elimi-
nate the birds laying the lower
grade eggs.

Six roosters with each 100
hens should give good fertility
and hatchability with Leg-
horns.

Egg shell color does not af-
fect the food value of eggs,
but it does make a difference
in the appearance. All brown
or all white eggs will com-
mand the highest prices.
