## SEASCOUITING TO THE FORE

That vigorous and picturesque branch of the boy scout program known as seascouting and designed in the interests of the older boy is to be opened up to all boy scout troops, no matter where they are located, according to the plan of the recent seascout conference.

Where the salty sea is not available, at least those features of the seascout program that can be carried out on land will be, such as navigation, astronomy, ship construction, signaling, wireless, sail-making, boat drill, sounding, map reading, charting, etc.

The objects of seascouting are identical with those of land scouting, with greater emphasis on nautical training. Because seascout training has proved of incalculable benefit to the older boy, the conference recommended in the interests of greater progress, that the formation of troops be simplified, and be made similar to that of land troops; also, that certain requirements be made for advancement in the first three ranks, as in land scouting, and that other advanced work be optional, as in the case of the Merit badge work of the land scout.

A seascout reserve is also recommended, the program of which is to be made available to all existing troops. This work of the reserve will develop more experts in water safety, thereby providing safety-first leadership in camps, and will make possible community life-saving units.

The blue and tan uniform is to be done away with, according to plans of the conference, and the regular sailor uniform is to be adopted. A special dress uniform for shore leave is also recommended.

At the conference fifty of the seventy-seven registered ships were represented.

In the nautical world are many prominent supporters of the character-building work of seascouting.

Admiral William S. Benson, U. S. N., who is one of these strong advocates of the work, has said: "The seascout training included in the boy scout program emphasizes the highest ideals and traditions of the sea, and by teaching the necessity in seafaring for such virtues as unselfishness, self-discipline, team work and obedience, makes for men of purpose and character."

To James A. Wilder, chief seascout, much of the success of this tritite branch of the scout movement is due.

### VALUABLE HOUSEHOLD RECIPES AND SUGGESTIONS

**Zeida's Cake**— $\frac{1}{2}$  cup butter,  $\frac{1}{2}$  level cups sugar,  $\frac{1}{4}$  cup milk, 1 teaspoon lemon extract,  $\frac{1}{2}$  level cups flour, 1 level teaspoon baking powder, 4 egg-whites. Cream the butter, add the sugar gradually, add the milk, flour, baking-powder, flavoring, and egg-whites, beaten dry. Beat the mixture thoroughly for from 3 to 5 minutes, turn into the prepared pan and let stand from 3 to 5 minutes before baking. Bake about fifty minutes.

**Favorite Sponge Cake**—3 eggs,  $\frac{1}{2}$  level cups sugar, 1 teaspoon Lemon Extract,  $\frac{1}{4}$  cups cola water,  $\frac{1}{2}$  level cups flour, 2 level teaspoons baking powder. Beat the eggs without separating the whites and yolks, until very thick; gradually beat in the sugar, then the lemon extract, and, alternately, the water, and the flour sifted with the baking powder. Bake from 20 to 25 minutes.

**Gold Cake**—1-3 cup butter,  $\frac{1}{2}$  cup sugar, 1 egg-yolk, 1-3 cup milk, 1 teaspoon vanilla extract,  $\frac{1}{2}$  level cups flour,  $\frac{1}{2}$  level teaspoons baking powder. Mix in the order given. Bake in two layers about fifteen minutes, cut the layers together with apple sauce jelly mixed with two or three chopped cooked figs. Sift confectioner's sugar over the top.

**Quick Cake**—1 level cup sugar,  $\frac{1}{2}$  level cups flour, 3 level teaspoons baking powder, 5 tablespoons melted butter,  $\frac{1}{4}$  level teaspoon salt, 1 teaspoon lemon extract, 2 eggs, milk. Put all the dry ingredients into a sieve and sift into a mixing bowl. Break the eggs into a cup and fill the cup with milk. Add to

ously until thoroughly blended. The dry ingredients with the butter and flavoring, and beat vigorously in two layers, in a loaf, or as cup cakes.

**One-Egg Cake**— $\frac{1}{4}$  cup butter,  $\frac{1}{2}$  cup sugar, 1 egg, beaten without separating white from yolk, 1 teaspoon lemon extract,  $\frac{1}{4}$  cup milk,  $\frac{1}{2}$  level cups pastry flour, 2 level teaspoons baking powder. Beat the butter to a cream; gradually beat in the sugar, egg, flavoring, milk, and flour sifted with the baking powder, in the order enumerated. Bake about twenty minutes. Eat while fresh baked.

**Lemon-Filled Cake**— $\frac{1}{2}$  cup of butter,  $\frac{1}{2}$  level cups sugar, 4 eggs, 2-3 cup milk,  $\frac{1}{2}$  level cups flour, 3 level teaspoons baking powder. Cream the shortening, the well-beaten egg-yolks and the milk. Sift together thoroughly the flour and baking powder, and add; then add the egg-whites beaten until stiff. Bake in layers and put together with lemon filling.

**Chocolate Cake**—2 level tablespoons butter, 1 level cup sugar, 1 egg,  $\frac{1}{4}$  level cups flour, 2 level teaspoons baking powder,  $\frac{1}{2}$  cup milk,  $\frac{1}{2}$  teaspoon vanilla. Melt one melted chocolate. Mix as One-Egg Cake, adding the vanilla and melted chocolate just before putting into the pan.

**Spanish Cake**—2 tablespoons melted butter, 1 level cup sugar, 3 eggs-yolks,  $\frac{1}{2}$  level teaspoons baking powder, 1 teaspoon cinnamon,  $\frac{1}{2}$  cup milk. Cream the shortening, add gradually the sugar, then the egg-yolks, beaten until light colored. Sift together thoroughly the flour, baking powder and cinnamon, and add alternately with the milk to the first mixture. Bake in layers. Spread a good frosting between and on top.

**Cream Cake**—2 eggs, 2-3 cup cream, 1 level cup sugar, 1-2 level cups flour,  $\frac{1}{2}$  level teaspoon salt,  $\frac{1}{2}$  level teaspoons baking powder, 1 teaspoon cinnamon,  $\frac{1}{4}$  level teaspoon mace,  $\frac{1}{4}$  level teaspoon ginger. Break the eggs into a bowl, add the cream and sugar, and beat vig-

ously. Sift together thoroughly, flour, salt, baking powder, mace and ginger, and add to the first mixture.

**Feather Cake**—1-3 cup butter, 1 level cup sugar, 2 egg-yolks,

$\frac{1}{2}$  cup milk,  $\frac{1}{2}$  level cups of flour, 3 level teaspoons baking powder, 2 egg-whites, beaten dry 1 teaspoon vanilla. Cream the butter, beat in the sugar, the eggs beaten light, the vanilla, and, alternately, the milk and

the flour sifted with the baking powder; lastly beat in the whites and beat the mixture from 3 to 5 minutes. Bake in a loaf about forty minutes. Cover with boiled frosting with or without coconut.

The heavier breeds of chickens should be hatched in February so they will mature in time for heavy fall production. March and April is the best time for hatching the egg breeds as they mature faster. If hatched at this time the birds get the benefit of better feed and range conditions, and the invigorating influence of the hot weather.

Lambing season in the Willamette valley is now on. The little lambs should be docked as early as possible, preferably before they are 10 days old. Otherwise, rush of other farm work is apt to cause neglect, resulting in lambs going to market with long tails. Undocked sheep are often docked in price at market, 25 to 30 cent cuts not being uncommon. It's more economical for the sheep grower to dock the lambs than to be docked in price.

The man who is most successful in the poultry business is the one who gets his eggs hatched so the birds will mature in time to get the high fall prices paid for eggs. Usually the prices begin to drop in January and at this time the experienced man will cull out the poor layers for the market.

It is customary to run the incubator for several days before the eggs are put in to make sure that it will maintain an even temperature. Many thousands of eggs are spoiled annually because this advice is not followed.

Moss and lichens on fruit trees may be quickly destroyed during the winter by spraying with ordinary lye at the rate of one pound to 6 or 8 gallons of water. If San Jose or other scale is present add the lye dissolved in a little water to the usual winter strength lime-sulfur. A thorough spraying of this solution will remove both the moss and scale. Lye removes moss most rapidly but not permanently. For permanent prevention the usual Bordeaux spray is recommended. Applied for apple tree anthracnose, peach leaf curl, and prune and cherry blossom blight it will prevent the moss from developing.

**ONE TO NINE IS RATIO**

Proper pollination is the main limiting factor in sweet cherry production. In planting cherry orchards pollinizers are best included in the ratio of one pollinizer to nine other trees. This ratio will vary in different sections according to weather conditions. Since pollination depends upon insects their efficiency as pollinizers depends upon favorable weather conditions that will permit them to visit the flowers.
