CAULIFLOWER

Cauliflower is one of the most sensitive vegetables to unfavorable growing conditions and the better it is understood the better the results will be.

The soil is the most important factor in raising the plant. When the soil is in a rich loamy condition, full of humus or organic matter, it will naturally produce a fine large plant which is usually responsible for a good head. Cauliflower resuires an unusual amount of soil moisture and responds best where it is possible to irrigate during the dry summer period.

The best seeds are imported from Europe. The cheap seed is worthless, and a good uniform field of first grade heads can come only from a high grade seed strain. The good seed also produces a large, solid, white head on a short stem, on which the leaves of the head fold closely about, thus protecting it from weather conditions before mar-

MEXICAN REVOLUTION FAILS TO HALT S. P. ACTIVITIES

The revolutionary activities in Mexico have not resulted in suspension of train operation or construction work on the S. P. of Mexico, according to an announcement just made by H. B. | ton's birthday, February 22. This Titcomb, President of the Co., at Tueson, Arizona.

"Reports-that operation of our lines between Tepic and Mazatlan has been suspended - are without foundation," Mr Titcomb stated. "The only interruption to service was from December 10 to 14, and that was at the request of Mexican military authorities who used equipment and trains for military purposes in that district. There has been no interruption since that time and construction work on our new line between La Quemada and Tepic has not been interfered with."

TIPS FOR TAXPAYERS

In the making of his 1923 income tax return the business man, the professional man, and the farmer may deduct from gross income all items properly attributable to business expenses. In the case of a storekeeper they include amounts spent for rent of his place of business, advertising, premiums, insurance against fire or other losses, the cost of water, light, and heat used in his place of business, drayage and freight bills, the cost of maintenasce and repairs to his delivery wagons and trucks, and a reason able allowance for salary of employees. A professional man lawyer, doctor, or dentist may deduct the cost of supplies used in his profession, expenses paid in the operation and repair ofan automobile used in making professional calls, dues to professional societies, subscriptions
