ADVENTISTS CONVENE AT FOREST GROVE

Forest Grove through its officials and citizens, has opened its City Gate to admit the hundreds of people who will attend the annual convention of the Western Oregon Conference of Seventh Day Adventists. All through the day the campers came by stage, train, and automobile from all parts of the western part of Oregon and nearby points in the western part of Washington to take up their temporary abode in the floored and comfortably appointed tents prepared for them by an advance guard of workmen.

The convention, which will continue for eleven days, opened on Tuesday evening with an address of welcome by Mayor W. C. Schultz of Forest Grove, who extended the hospitality of the beautiful auto park and the courtesies of the Chamber of Commerce, and merchants of Forest Grove to the delegates and visitors attending the convention. Elder J. W. Norwood of Portland, who is president of the Western Oregon Conference, responded in behalf of the delegates.

Elder Morris Lukens, president, North Pacific Union Conference, Walla Walla, Washington, which comprises the states of Oregon, Washington, Idaho, Montana, and the territory of Alaska, delivered the opening sermon on "A Prophetic People with a Prophetic Message." Mr. Lukens was for years a missionary to Australia, and has been for years a successful evangelist and executive for his people.
