VALUABLE HOUSEHOLD RECIPES AND SUGGESTIONS

Pie—Make a rich pie crust, line gem pans with this, and fill with a good pumpkin pie mixture. Bake until they puff up and brown. A spoonful of whipped cream at serving time is a charming addition.

English Currant Loaf—1 cake compressed yeast, one cup milk (scalded and cooled to lukewarm), one egg, one-fourth cup butter, one-fourth cup brown sugar, three and one-half cups sifted flour, one-half teaspoon salt, one-half teaspoon cinnamon or nutmeg, one-half cup washed and dried currants. Dissolve the yeast in the milk, add about one and one-half cups

flour, to make a drop batter, cover and let rise until light and spongy. Add the sugar, salt, cinnamon, melted butter, well-beaten egg and currants, with flour to make a soft dough. Beat or knead thoroughly until no longer sticky, but keep the dough very soft. Cover and let rise in a warm place in well-greased pans, brushing the tops with melted butter. Let rise again, then bake about an hour in a moderate oven.

Cold Cucumber Pickles—One gallon of vinegar, one cup of salt, one cup of brown sugar, one cup of dry mustard. Dissolve dry ingredients in vinegar and use to cover cucumbers in crocks. One cup of horseradish may if desired be added.

Stuffed Apples—Core the apples and fill the cavities with equal parts pecans and raisins. Bake and serve with whipped

cream or a good sauce.
Oatmeal Cookies—Two eggs, one-half cup sugar, half cup sour cream, one-half cup sour milk, one-half cup finely ground oatmeal, one teaspoon salt, one teaspoon each of cinnamon and cloves, nutmeg and cocoa or chocolate, two teaspoons baking powder, one-half teaspoon soda, flour to roll. Cream the shortening and sugar, add the eggs, well-beaten, fold in the other ingredients, chill, toss on a floured board, roll out, cut and bake in a moderate oven. Use as little flour as possible in order to avoid a hard texture.
