FARM REMINDERS

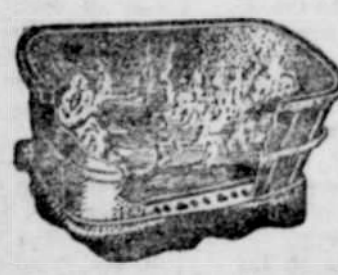

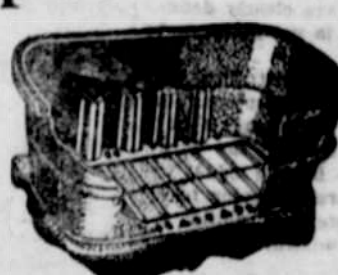

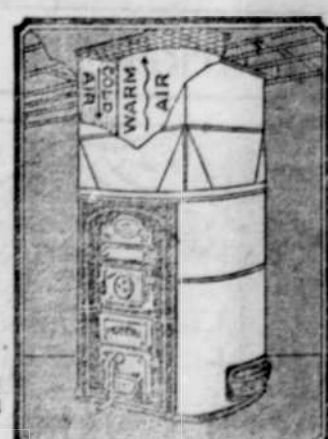
The MONTAG Oval Firepot as a wood-burner
