Cocoa Gingerbread-1 cup of nolasses, 4 cup sour milk, ! tablespoons fat, I teaspoon soda. 1 teaspoon cold water, 1 teaspoon ginger, I teaspoon einnanon, 1/2 teaspoon salt. 5 tablespoons cocoa, 2 cups flour. Mix nolasses and sour milk. Add fat and the soda dissolved in the cold water. Add dry ingredients. Pour into cake tins and bake about twenty minutes in a moderate oven. This may be covered with an icing before serving, if desired.

Cinnamon Buns 24 cups of flour, 4 teaspoons baking powder, 1/4 cup sugar, 2 tablespoons shortening, 2 teaspoons cinnamon, 4 tablespoons seeded raisins, 1/2 cup water, 1 egg. Take 2 tablespoons from the measured sugar and sift with the flour, salt and baking powder into a powl; rub shortening in very lightly with the tips of the fingers; add beaten egg to water: and add slowly; roll out onehird of an inch thick on a floured board; brush with little melted butter, sprinkte with sugar, einnamon and raisins which have been washed and drained. Roll as for jelly roll: cut into one and one-half inch pieces; place with cut edges up. an a well-greased pan; sprinkle with a little sugar and cinnamon and bake in moderate oven for thirty or thirty-five minutes. 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
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
