VALUABLE HOUSEHOLD RECIPES AND SUGGESTIONS

Vegetable Salmagundi—One cup each carrots cut in strips, one cup cooked peas or Lima beans, one large onion, green pepper, two cups canned tomatoes, three tablespoons butter or shortening, salt, a little sugar and lemon juice to taste. Slice the onions and cook carefully in the butter or shortening until soft and golden and very slightly brown. Add the tomatoes, strained, and cook rapidly until reduced one-third. Add the other cooked vegetables and heat them through. Season to taste.

Ginger Ice Cream—One quart rich milk, three eggs, two tablespoons cornstarch, 1 cup sugar, one pint cream, one cup very finely chopped Chinese ginger and ginger syrup mixed. Scald the milk, combine with the sugar and cornstarch and bring to boiling point. Add the egg yolks well beaten, the whites may be beaten with the yolks or added later with the ginger. Cook the mixture over hot water until the eggs thicken, then let it cool and place it in the freezer. Freeze in the usual way, and when frozen to a mush add the ginger and finish freezing.

Mutton Hot Pot—Pare and slice six or eight medium-sized potatoes. Place a layer in the bottom of a casserole and put in three mutton chops. Add two lamb kidneys, sliced or chopped, one finely chopped onion; six or eight oysters and a little salt and pepper. Put a layer of potatoes over this and pour over all one cup of good stock. Brush the potatoes with melted butter. Bake three hours or longer. Serve in the casserole.

Cooked Salad Dressing—From two to six tablespoons butter, two tablespoons flour, three-quarters cup milk or water, 1 to 4 egg yolks, vinegar, salt and sugar as needed. Melt the butter in the upper part of the

double boiler, add the flour, cook directly over the fire without boiling until the mixture is boiling. Add the milk, raise to boiling point, set over hot water and beat in egg yolks and seasonings, cooking just long enough to thicken the yolks.

Chili con Carne—Mince three onions and put with three or four tablespoons of olive oil smoking hot in a frying pan, and to this add three red peppers minced fine. Have about one and one-half pounds of lean beef, cut in dice and when the onions turn yellow add the meat, gradually, stirring occasionally, so as to sear it. After cooking 5 or 10 minutes, add a cup of hot water and cover and let simmer about 2 hours. In a separate kettle heat one or two cans of kidney beans, mix a tablespoon of flour with water for thickening and before adding pour a large tablespoon of catsup over the meat; be sure to keep enough water in the mixture to prevent burning. Cook ten minutes. Drain the beans and add. Serve hot.

Salmon Loaf—One can salmon, four eggs beaten until they are light, one level tablespoonful melted butter, two cups of fine bread or cracker crumbs. Season with pepper, salt and parsley. Chop the fish fine with the butter in it until it is smooth. Beat the bread crumbs with the eggs and season before working together. Put in a buttered baking dish and bake for an hour.

Sauce for Salmon Loaf—One cup of hot milk, one tablespoon cornstarch or flour and the liquor from the salmon, one tablespoonful butter, one raw egg, one level tablespoonful tomato catsup and a pinch of red pepper. Put the egg in carefully at the last and boil for one minute.

Warm Current Exists, No Matter How Cold

It was with some consternation that one read in the newspapers that the Gulf stream had been proved a myth. If one of the sacred scientific trinity had died, what was to become of the others—the nebular hypothesis and the law of gravitation?

A closer reading, however, was reassuring, remarks the New York Evening Mail. It appears that M. Le Danols, a French savant, asserts that there is no such thing as a Gulf stream. What is called by that name is a combination of ocean tides.

There are, he says, two kinds of water in the North Atlantic, warm and cold. The warm moves in a northward current, but some undetermined point and turns backward again. The fluctuations, however, are tidal.
One has a vague memory of reading something very like that in the physical geography book about twenty years ago. Apparently the phenomena exist, whether one explains them by the term Gulf stream or as ocean tides. That which we call a Gulf stream by another name will smell as sweet to migratory herring and sardine and, happily, one can still paraphrase "Home and Juliet" regardless of whether Bacon or Shakespeare wrote it. And the warm Atlantic current still saves Europe from a return to the glacial period regardless of whether one accepts the nomenclature of Franklin or that of M. Le Danols.
