**OBITUARY**  
John Miller was born in Jasper Co., Illinois, June 25, 1860, the son of Mr. and Mrs. J. B. Miller.

He attended school in Jefferson Co., Ill., and in 1907 came west with his parents and their family.

He worked in the woods in different jobs in five different states, Oregon, California, Idaho, Washington and Montana. In 1913 he was married to Miss Myrtle Clark of Columbia County at St. Helens.

About two years ago he accepted a position as longshoreman on the Portland wharves and was a wench driver. While at his work Jan. 26 in some manner the load that his machine was lifting, dropped, and his skull was fractured. He was taken to St. Vincent's hospital where he died Feb. 10.

He was brought to Beaverton on the morning of the 11th on the M. & N. was placed in the Beaverton Morgue. Funeral arrangements have not been made.

He leaves to mourn his loss his mother and father, his wife and four small children, four brothers, Charles, Sull, Frank and Orville; three sisters, Ruth, Myrtle and Alice.

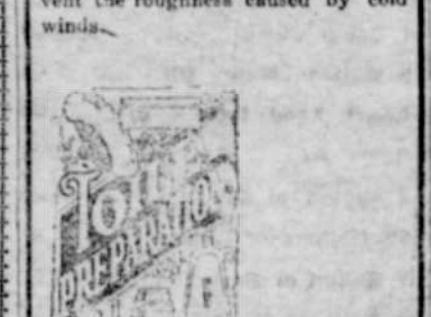
**ILLUSTRATED LECTURE TO BE GIVEN MONDAY**

### FARM REMINDERS

Applications of land plaster in March increases the growth of Oregon vetch. At the rate of 77 pounds an acre it will help out the weak stands of fall and spring planted vetch which were damaged by the cold weather last winter. When fertilizers are applied to the normal stand there will be an increase in growth but not so noticeable as when put on the weak or thinner stands.

A chick costing a little more than the average may lay a dozen or two more eggs as a pullet, according to Professor A. G. Lunn, of the O. A. G. experiment station. One or two more eggs in the fall will more than pay this additional cost of the chick.
