Things To Watch In Buying a Home

Being as a home is something that is not bought often in the average person's life they should consider very carefully before investing their money. With this in mind I have prepared a series of articles with the hope that they will be of some use to those who are contemplating building or buying a home.

The ordinary bungalow with only dining and living room combined, two bedrooms, kitchen and bath, has been found to be insufficient to meet the requirements of the better class of Americans.

The bungalow of the kind that generally sells for \$3500 to \$4000 is very expensive to build from a standpoint of room as compared to larger houses of other types. Houses of this price generally are built on a foundation of concrete set into the ground about 1 foot and extending two to four feet high. By extending the foundation down a few feet a basement may be had, thereby doubling the floor space of the house, though of course this can only be done where the drainage is very good.

In single story houses the stairway to the basement is very often a place of waste space, which could be used to advantage if a second story is added, as the stairway to the upper floor can go up directly over the basement steps. In a two-bedroom house it is difficult to entertain guests, as

owing to crowded space there is no room for their sleeping quarters. This additional space will be found economical even though used at times only for storage.

In the ordinary bungalow the roof is extended at least two feet beyond the walls all the way around. This is a waste of material, easily seen if you will examine the sidewalls both close to the eaves and lower down. You will find that the extended roof has not afforded any protection to the paint from sun or rain. By using the material in this extension to build a steep roof without so much projection, as is done in English style houses, more room may be had under the roof without building the side walls any higher than is necessary in a one story house. The

steeper roof will more readily shed the water and does not present so flat a surface for the sun to heat down on, thereby giving a more durable shelter and better protection.

If you were to build a one-story bungalow with the same floor space as will be found in the English type house with its first and second floor the cost would be so great that it might be necessary to dispense with basement, laundry room, fur-

nace, garage, walks, street improvements, and other conveniences that help to make home life pleasant and comfortable.
