## Household Dept.

**God's oil mixed with ashes is fine for scouring galvanized iron wear, steel knives, tin wear and the steel of the range. It a little of this mixture is used in cleaning oil cloth, the cloth will last longer and look better.**

**When a lemon has become dry, do not throw it away. Place it in a pan of hot water and put this where it will remain the same temperature for two hours. Lemons treated in this way will be soft and after more juicy than when received from the store.**

**When lard is to be needed for greasing the griddle on a picnic or camping trip carry it along in a long slender olive or pickle bottle. Wrap a stick with a clean cloth to make a swap at one end and insert the other end in the cork of the bottle.**

**A little pottery jar that I prized cracked several inches down the side. The crack showed very little but made the jar useless for flowers. I then heated a stick of sealing wax and applied it along the crack on the inside after warming the jar well. Now my jar is as good as new and is in constant use.—M. J. T.**

**Uncooked Cake Frosting—Run half a cup of fresh strawberries or red raspberries through a wire sieve, adding a quarter of a cup of coconut, and enough confectioners' sugar to make it of the right consistency to spread. It is a delightful pink color and has a fresh-fruit flavor. A sprinkling of coconut over the top of the cake adds to its appearance.**

**Cookies—**1/2 cup shortening, 2 cups sugar, 1/2 cups milk, 2 eggs beaten light, 1/2 teaspoon grated nutmeg, 4 cups flour, 3 teaspoonfuls baking powder. Mix in order given. Roll thin, cut, and bake in a moderate oven.—Mrs. J. E. Mittel.

**Brown Sugar Cookies—**1 scan sifted flour, 2 heaping teaspoonfuls of cream of tartar and 1 teaspoonful of soda. Make hole in flour and drop in 2 cups brown sugar, 1 cup butter, or 2-3 cup mazola, 1 teaspoonful vanilla, 1 teaspoonful lemon extract, 4 eggs. Work altogether with hands, roll out thin, cut in any shape desired, and drop one teaspoonful filling on each cookie. Place another cookie on top, and press edges firmly together.

**Filling for Cookies—**2 cups raisins, put this food chopper 1 cup dates or figs, 1 cup of chopped nuts, 1 cup sugar, 2 teaspoonful flour, 1 cup of water, and flavoring. Let boil a few minutes until it thickens.—Mrs. J. E. Mittel.
