VALUABLE HOUSEHOLD RECIPES AND SUGGESTIONS

Peanut Muffins—1/2 cup of corn meal, one and one-fourth cups flour, one cup finely ground peanuts, one egg, one teaspoon salt, one and one-fourth cups milk, four to six spoons baking powder. Add liquid to dry ingredients and mix well. Bake in well-greased muffin pans.

Peanut-Potato Sausages—One cup mashed potatoes, one cup ground roasted peanuts, one egg, well beaten, one and one-half teaspoons salt, one-eighth teaspoon pepper; salt pork, bacon, or other fat. Mix the mashed potatoes and seasonings with the ground nuts. Add beaten egg. Form into little cakes or sausages, roll in flour, meal, or bread-crumbs, and place in greased pan with a small piece of fat or salt pork on each sausage. Bake in a fairly hot oven until brown.

Peanut Brownies—One-half cup corn syrup, 2 tablespoons strained honey, one square chocolate, three-fourths cup of buckwheat flour, one-half teaspoon baking powder, one cup chopped peanuts, one-fourth teaspoon salt, one teaspoon of vanilla. Melt the chocolate and mix with the corn syrup and honey. To this add one teaspoon vanilla and the dry ingredients—the flour, baking powder, salt, and nuts. Mix well and drop by the spoonful on well-greased pan. Bake in a moderate oven.

Peanut Fondue—One cup of finely ground peanuts, one cup dried bread-crumbs, one egg, one and two-thirds cups of milk, one and one-half teaspoons salt, a dash of paprika. Grind the peanuts fine. Mix all the ingredients except the white of egg. Beat egg white very stiff and fold in. Bake in a buttered baking dish for thirty to forty minutes in a moderate oven.

FARM REMINDERS

In some rotation experiment at O. A. C., rotation has resulted in 50 per cent higher yield than was obtained by continuous crops, and the difference is growing larger each year. Beans grown continuously yielded 9.85 bushels an acre, while beans rotated after grain and clover yielded 15.71 bushels an acre.

"Liming" the soil was a well established practice in early Roman husbandry. Evidence has been found that even the ancients knew the value of limestone soil for producing satisfactory crops.

Results secured at the Union experiment station on the increased value of steamed alfalfa was found, but not enough to justify the expense for steaming. Steaming alfalfa or clover for hogs has not proved satisfactory at Corvallis.

Light and land-plaster applications have helped vetch yields slightly in the experiments and paid for a short time. On some soils large increases are secured. Lime applications did not pay on this trial, although on some very acid soils good results are obtained.

Very little pruning is ordinarily necessary in the case of the joganberry. If the canes are healthy and vigorous, they may be trained at full length. Occasionally, when the rope system is used, the canes are so long they interfere with the next plant. In this case the ends should be shortened a little. Frequently canes are produced which are not long enough to be attached to the trellis. These bear but little fruit and may interfere with the new shoots. Such canes should be removed. Old canes should be taken away as soon as the crop has been harvested. This practice gives the new shoots more air and sunlight. It also aids materially in keeping down insect pests and diseases.

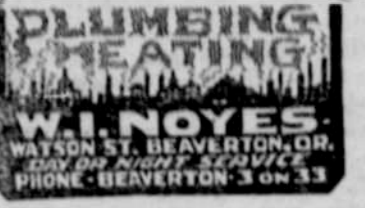

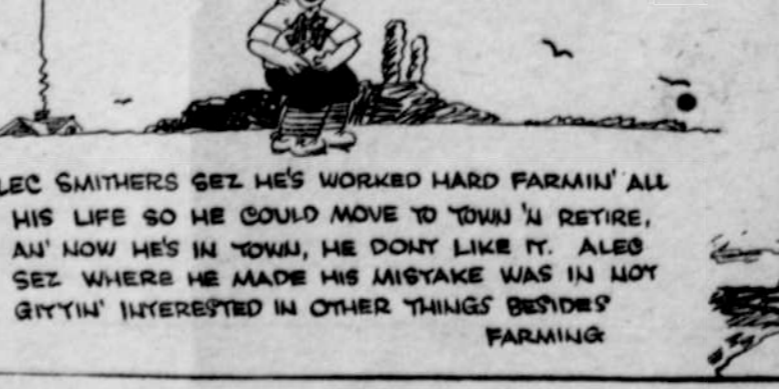
