VALUABLE HOUSEHOLD RECIPES AND SUGGESTIONS

**Roasted Peanuts on Toast**—Two cups milk, one cup finely ground roasted peanuts, one teaspoon salt, one teaspoon of cornstarch, one teaspoon of onion juice, one-fourth cup chopped stuffed olives. Canned pimientos, chopped green peppers cooked until tender, or cooked celery are equally delicious.

**Seal milk in the double boiler**, reserving a tablespoon of cold milk to mix with the cornstarch. Add with onion juice and other seasonings to the hot milk. Let come to a boil and finish cooking over the double boiler. Add the peanuts the last thing before serving. Serve on toast.

**Creamed Peanuts and Rice**—One cup uncooked rice, 2 cups chopped peanuts, one-half teaspoon paprika, two teaspoons of salt. White sauce: three tablespoons flour, three tablespoons fat, three cups milk. Boil the rice and make a white sauce by mixing the flour in the fat, which is melted, and mixing with the milk. Stir over fire until it thickens. Mix rice, peanuts, and seasoning with the sauce, place in greased baking dish, and bake for twenty minutes.

**Sweet Potato and Peanut Croquettes**—One cup of mashed sweet potato, one cup chopped peanuts, one-half teaspoon of salt, a few grains of pepper, one cup bread crumbs, four tablespoons butter, one cup of white sauce, two tablespoons chili sauce. Mix sweet potato, peanuts finely chopped, salt, and pepper and shape like croquettes. Roll in fine bread crumbs mixed with butter and bake in a hot oven until they are brown. Serve with the white sauce mixed with chili sauce.

**Prune Cake**—One cup sugar one cup prunes cut in three or four pieces, one cup prune juice, two beaten eggs, two cups flour, a pinch of salt, one cup butter, one small teaspoon soda, one small teaspoon each of cinnamon, nutmeg, and allspice.—Mrs. J. E. Mittel.

**Chocolate Cake**—One scant cup of sugar, one egg, two squares chocolate melted with one tablespoon butter, one cup sour cream, one level teaspoon soda dissolved in one tablespoon hot water, one and one-half cups sifted flour, a pinch of salt, and vanilla.—Mrs. J. E. Mittel.

**FARM REMINDERS**

Oregon wheat crop for 1925 as estimated by the federal bureau of economics will be brought up a little past the 1924 crop by means of the successful seeding plantings. The winter wheat crop is but little more than half that of last year, but the spring crop is one and three-fourths times as large. The combined crop this year is put at 16,852,000 bushels, of which more than 10 millions are spring wheat. The large spring output is due to the replanting of winter killed areas to spring varieties.

Grain certification has been carried on for eight years by the agricultural college at Corvallis to standardize the best varieties for the grain growing counties. Grain dealers in a single eastern Oregon county say that wheat growers formerly took a \$25,000 loss annually because of mixtures now practically eliminated by use of certified seed.

Feed for the family poultry flock—two or three hens per member—need not prove much of a problem in Oregon. It is usually better to buy the feed already mixed. Garden wastes, lawn clippings, and other green feed will generally supply the flock. Use of table scraps will still further cut down the cost of keeping the flock.

Need of lime in the soil is indicated by the way certain plants grow. If red clover will grow luxuriantly in Oregon the probabilities are that the soil is not sour. If it fails persistently either lime is needed or a radical change in the cropping system is needed, the O. A. C. experiment station says. The state provides lime to the farmers at the cost of production through the state lime plant at Gold Hill.
