OFFICERS NOMINATED AT CITY CAUCUS

Nearly 50 people attended the caucus held in the high school auditorium Monday evening, the 23rd of November. This was the regular caucus, called by the City Council at their monthly meeting the first Monday in November. E. W. Woodruff acted as chairman and W. L. Cady clerk of the meeting. Mayor W. E. Pegg was the only candidate for his office mentioned, and was unanimously nominated to succeed himself. Mr. Fordney placed in nomination the names of J. W. Sprague and E. W. Woodruff; and Mr. Welter placed in nomination the names of A. Rossi and Mr. Feldman for Councilmen for two years. While the discussion about the candidates was going on Mr. Sprague entered the room and withdrew his name, after which the meeting proceeded to ballot for 2 of the three, Feldman, Rossi, and Woodruff. The vote stood, Feldman 27, Rossi 26, Woodruff 24. The chairman then declared Mr. Feldman and Mr. Rossi the candidates for Councilmen for two years. Mr. Woodruff was then nominated for Councilman for one year to succeed J. W. Sprague, and the nomination was made unanimous. Only one man's name was mentioned for Recorder, Geo. Thayer was nominated by W. I. Noyes, and the nomination was seconded by C. W. Noyes. It was then voted to name the ticket the Gilfeans' Ticket.
