FARM REMINDERS

Factors determining the income from a herd of cattle in Oregon are listed in a recent experiment station bulletin on cost of producing beef as follows: Calf crop; quality, weight and market price of animals sold; death losses. Each of these is said to be of enough importance to receive special consideration.

Nicotine sulfate as sold in Oregon in liquid form will keep indefinitely without loss of strength. The highest grade is a solution of nearly 50 per cent nicotine sulfate in water containing 40 per cent nicotine. The only forms in which it is available are black leaf 40, Hall's 40 per cent nicotine, N. P. C. nicotine, and Ortho nicotine sulfate. Nicotine dusts may be either stable or unstable.
