More than 100,000,000 rabbit skins are now utilized annually in this country, about 98 per cent of which are imported. Of this number about 55,000, dressed and dyed are made into fur garments and into trimmings for women's coats, suits and dresses. The remainder, not suitable for garments, are used as linings for men's and boy's gloves and in the manufacture of felt, used chiefly for making hats. With the disappearance of many of the fine-pelted fur bearers from many parts of the United States the use of rabbit skins is steadily increasing. Aided by modern processes, American fur dressers and dyers have become so expert in changing the colors and appearance of furs that in many instances the pelt of the rabbit, under a variety of trade names, is replacing other skins more costly and attractive, as ermine, seal, beaver, and leopard.
