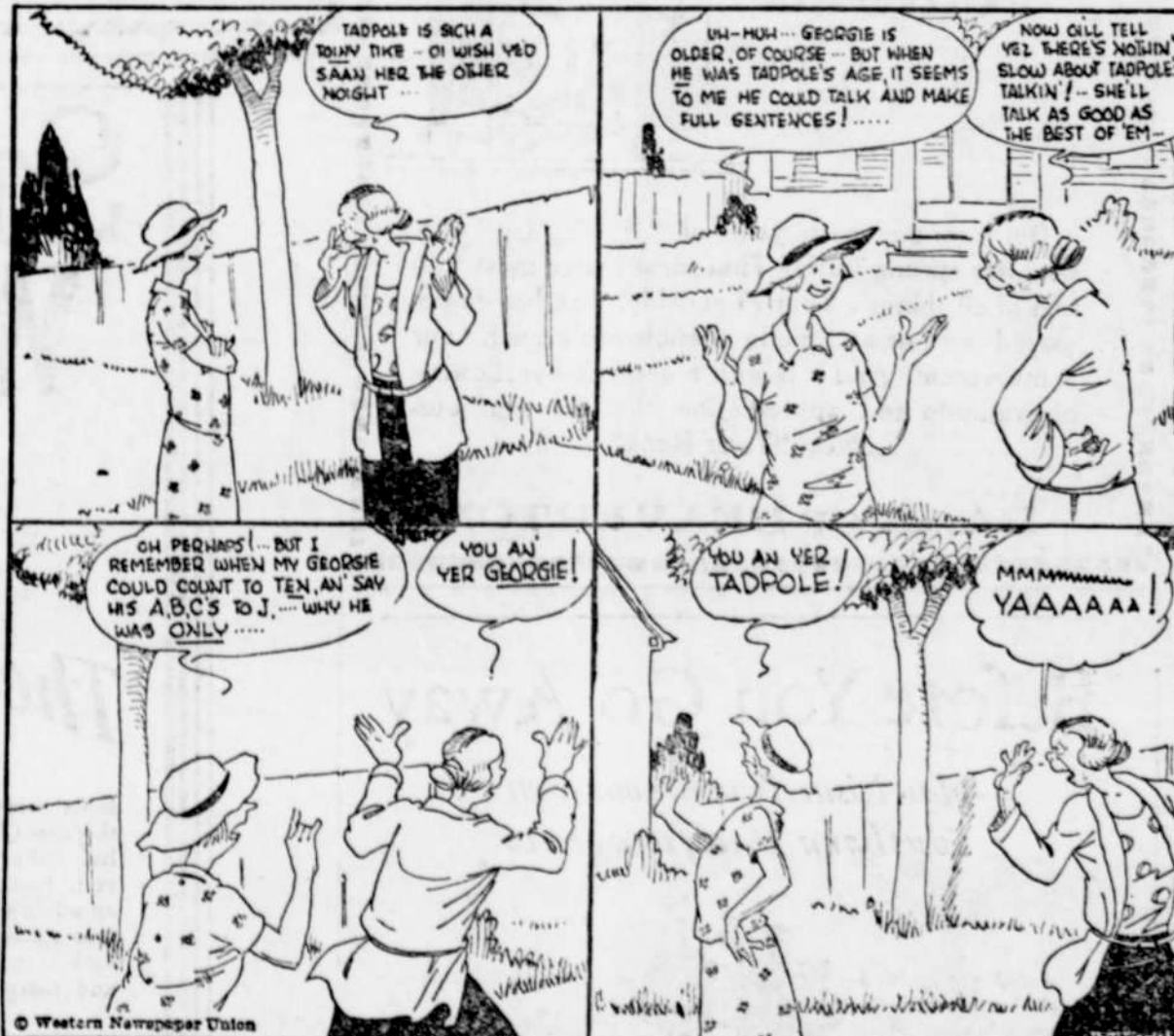

Plan your work ahead.

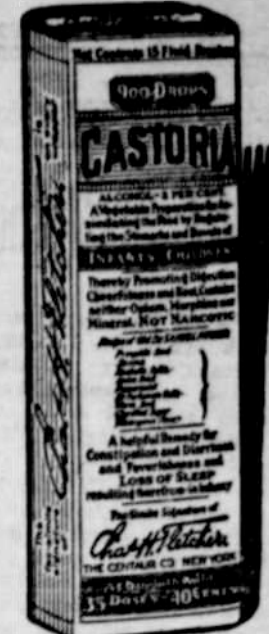
Do one thing at a time.
