DOG LICENSE NOTICE

January 1st, 1930, dog licenses are due and payable on all dogs over 8 months old and owned or kept in the state of Oregon over 30 days.

The license fees are: male dog, two dollars, (\$2.00); female dog, three dollars, (\$3.00); spayed female dog, two dollars, (\$2.00).

After March 1st, 1930, a penalty accrues, and then the license fees are: male dog, four dollars, (\$4.00); female dog, five dollars, (\$5.00); spayed female dog, four dollars, (\$4.00).

Licenses may be obtained by mail or in person from the county clerk at Hillsboro, Oregon.

When writing, state whether a male, female or spayed female dog, and the name and address of the owner or keeper thereof.
