FARM REMINDERS
The earwig has become so well established in Oregon that its total eradication cannot be expected by the use of poisons, which is still the standard method of control. All that can be hoped for is a reduction of numbers of the pest.
Because the maggots of the cherry fruit fly which has been causing serious damage to the cherry crop in parts of Oregon in recent years, are hatched under the skin of the fruit, the only method of control is through an attack on the fly.
It is best not to allow rape seed to shatter on fields where it is not wanted as the seed is oily and may live in the soil for many years. Where shattering has taken place, the best course is to let it sprout, then disk and work shallow at intervals before plowing. It is usually best not to fall-plow such land, as letting the seed lie exposed on or near the surface through the winter will cut off much of it.
