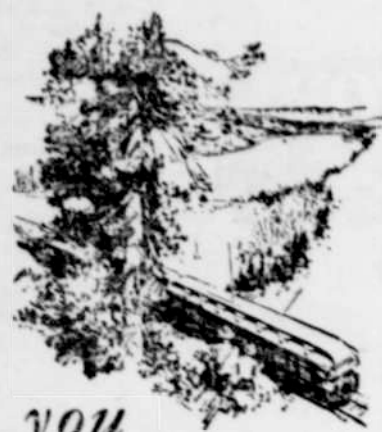


LOCAL HAPPENINGS
