RECEPTION GIVEN FOR MR. AND MRS. MEATS

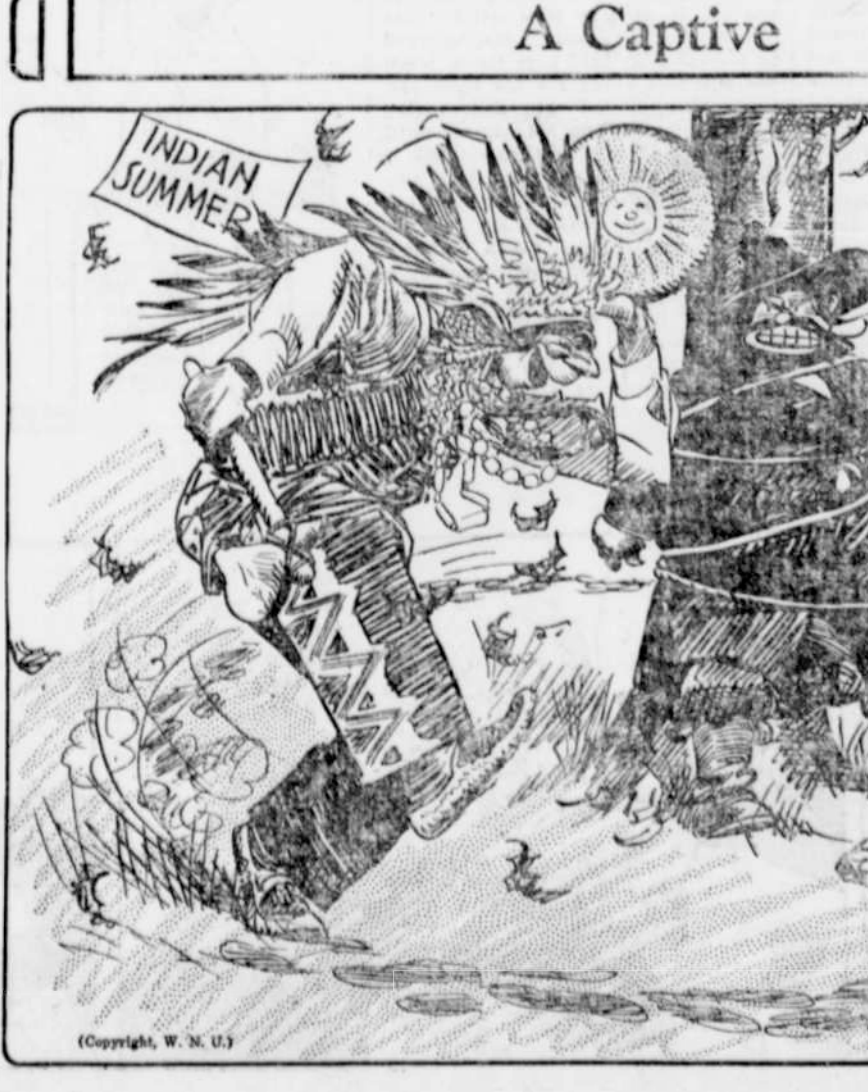
