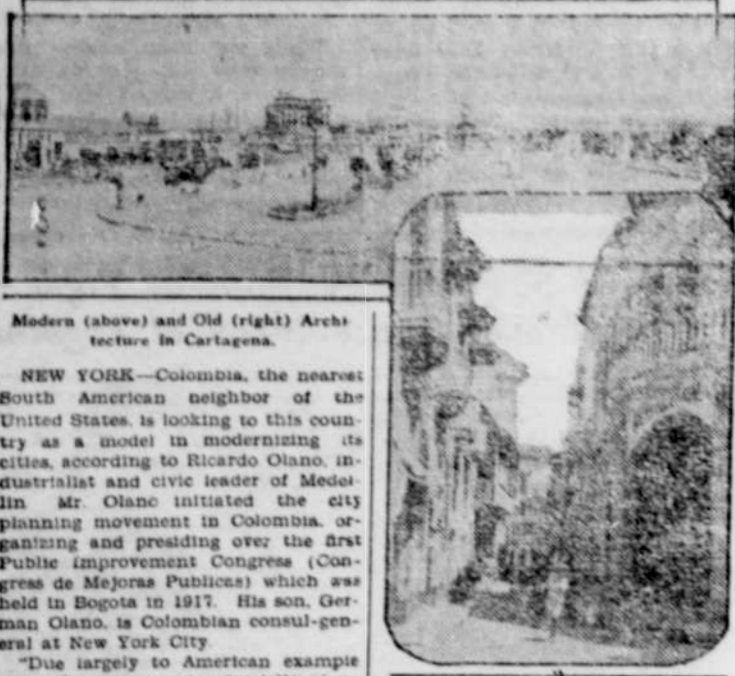


**U. S. Cities Serve as Models In
Colombia's Modernization Plan**

NEW YORK—Colombia, the nearest South American neighbor of the United States is looking to this country as a model in modernizing its cities, according to Ricardo Olano, industrialist and civic leader of Medellin. Mr. Olano initiated the city planning movement in Colombia, organizing and presiding over the first Public Improvement Congress (Congreso de Mejoras Publicas) which was held in Bogota in 1917. His son, German Olano, is Colombian consul-general at New York City.

"Due largely to American example and influence, an extensive city planning movement has developed throughout Colombia during the last few years," Mr. Olano said. "As a result, most of the cities in Colombia are being transformed from ancient colonial settlements into modern metropolitan centers having both the aspect and conveniences of those in the United States. Bogota, the capital, following the example of Medellin, which is the center of the region where the finest coffee is grown, adopted a beautification program and today is one of the most modern and progressive cities in South America. Cali, in the heart of the Cauca valley, which also is famous for its fine coffee, now offers many modern attractions.

"In many sections of the country modern suburbs like those of leading American cities either have been laid

WHEN you pay the price for a thick juicy steak see that it is properly prepared and served. It's a crime not to take advantage of such an opportunity.

Try rubbing a mixture of one teaspoon each of salt and sugar and one-fourth teaspoon pepper into your steak. This is not enough to sweeten the meat but will seal in the juices, help form a crisp brown crust through the caramelizing of the sugar, and thus preserve the entire flavor.

Dot with butter and serve on a hot platter. Your guests or family will assure you that you have mastered the cooking of steaks.

Eugene—A demonstration to determine the value of superphosphate on Ladino clover pasture, carried out by H. J. Merz of Ada, shows that the fertilizer stimulated growth on poor spots but gave no material results where the soil was in good condition, says County Agent Fletcher who cooperated in the test.

ON OREGON FARMS

A system of overhead irrigation for pasture land which is said to be well suited to uneven ground such as is found in western Oregon river bottoms is proving successful this season on the Frank Hall farm near here. This system, installed through the co-operation of the Oregon Experiment station and County Agent C. R. Eriggs, is being used by Mr. Hall to irrigate 10 acres with a supply of water amounting to only about 70 gallons per minute. Cost of equipment was \$650, which is considered exceptionally low for an overhead system.

Hillsboro—Strawberry growers of Washington county are going ahead with plans for improvement of their business next year despite the present disastrous price season, reports County Agent W. T. Cyrus. Several growers are making plans to take advantage of the newly offered certification service for strawberry plant producers, or will follow methods suggested for developing disease free stock for their own use.
