CHRISTMAS TREE FACTS

Foresters recommend the use of Christmas trees, provided the trees are cut under proper forestry methods. Such cuttings, or thinnings, made under the direction of a forester, actually benefit the forest, it is said.

True conservatism is wise use, say the foresters. Properly harvesting a Christmas tree crop is a wise use of the forest resource, and the practice is endorsed.

Christmas tree vandalism is frowned upon by conservationists. Under vandalism are listed such things as stealing trees along roadsides, cutting and discarding several trees to find one perfect tree, cutting the tops of large trees, cutting thrifty young trees in open lands on land that should be devoted to commercial timber growing.

Commercial harvesters of Christmas trees are urged to canvass their available markets before cutting their stock of trees. Every year thousands of trees are cut and wasted because there is no market for them, according to the forest service.
