Sheriff Connel from between the cool, white sheets as the clock passed the midnight hour.

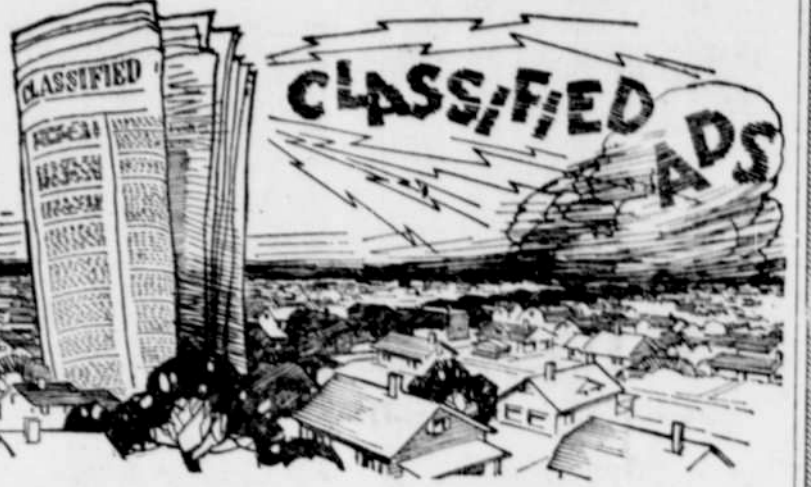
