



### Every Country Has Its Cookie—Better Have Your Share Today!

Cookie, cookie or cookie—spell it anyway you like, but cherish the name, for its the appellation of one of the finest, favorite, foodstuffs we have!

The Dutch gave us the word (from "koekje" meaning little cake) but every country except Iceland has its cookie—from the "Basler Leckerli" of Switzerland to the "Hallowi Dulce" of Irak.

A thousand cookie recipes are claimed to be in regular use throughout the world, and a brand new cook book allots 175 pages to "cookies and more cookies."

There are four kinds of cookies: rolled, dropped, filled and ice box. There's a cookie for every purse and for every taste. Since children are the largest cookie-consumers, and space denies reproducing a thousand recipes for you which are unusual, especially popular with the children and full of fruit—wholesome and delicious as well as "yum-inspiring"! Here you are:

#### Cocoanut Vanities

(For the Tea Party)

2 cups sifted cake flour  
2 teasp. baking powder  
1/4 teasp. salt  
1 tbsp. grated orange rind  
4 teasp. butter  
1 cup sugar  
1 egg, unbeaten  
1/4 cup milk  
1/2 cup orange juice  
4 teasp. sugar  
1 egg white, stiffly beaten  
1/2 cup cocoanut  
Sift flour once, measure, add baking powder and salt and sift together 3 times. Add orange rind to butter and cream thoroughly. Add flour, alternately with milk and orange juice, a small amount at a time. Beat after each addition until smooth. Turn into greased pan, 15 x 10 inches. Cover with thin layer of meringue made by beating sugar into egg white. Sprinkle with cocoanut. Bake in moderate oven (350° F.) 25 minutes. Cool. Cut in diamond-shaped pieces.

#### Whole Wheat Date Cookies

("Fruity"—For Health)

1 cup white flour  
2 teasp. baking powder  
1/4 teasp. salt  
1/4 teasp. soda  
1 cup whole wheat flour  
1/3 cup buttermilk  
1 cup dates, sliced  
1/2 cup shortening  
1 cup brown sugar  
1 egg  
1 teasp. vanilla  
Sift white flour, baking powder, soda and salt together. Add whole wheat flour. Mix dates through dry ingredients with finger tips. Cream shortening, add sugar gradually, then beaten egg. Add dry ingredients alternately with milk. Add vanilla and beat until well mixed. Drop by teaspoonfuls 2 inches apart on well-oiled baking sheet or inverted pan. Bake in fairly hot oven (400° F.) for about 10 minutes. 36 small cookies.

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### Alarmed by Record of Loss of Teeth Girls Resume Trek to Dental Chair

The three C's in dentistry—care, cleanliness and conservation—are as important to good health as are the three R's to education, declared the Dental Institute of America today.

Sickness and death enter through the mouth. Bad teeth are the danger signals to general health. With a cost of three and a half billion dollars for illness each year, the Institute says, more attention should be given to mouth hygiene. Less than \$200,000,000 of this high sickness bill goes for care of the teeth. The nation spends this much on soda pop.

Care of the teeth should begin before the baby is born. A diet with enough minerals to form the bones and teeth of the unborn child should be adhered to by the expectant mother. After the baby's first tooth appears, usually between five and nine months, the mother's real watchfulness should begin, the Institute points out.

Of the two million babies born each year in the United States, not over 10 percent are given care to insure healthy teeth in adult life. At the age of two and a half years professional care should begin. Surveys show four million of our school children have very serious dental defects. "At least a fourth of the 23,000,000 school children have wrongly positioned teeth. Not more than four percent have sound, well-formed teeth. Bad teeth breed illness. Toxins from decay, infections drain into the blood stream, bringing many illnesses in their wake. Regular visits to your dentist, and use of the toothbrush at least twice daily, are health measures for adult and child."

Due to neglect during the depression vast numbers of young people developed tooth infections necessitating extractions. This alarming situation, it is reported, has sent

#### Spiced Apple Sauce Cookies

(Different and Delicious)

1 cup sugar  
1 egg  
2 cups flour  
1/2 cup shortening  
1/2 teasp. cinnamon  
1/2 teasp. cloves  
1/2 teasp. salt  
1/2 teasp. soda  
1 teasp. baking powder  
1 cup thick unsweetened apple sauce  
Cream shortening. Add sugar gradually, creaming continuously. Whip in egg. Mix dry ingredients thoroughly and add alternately with the apple sauce. Blend thoroughly and drop from spoon on buttered cookie sheet about 2 inches apart. Bake in moderate oven until nicely browned. Remove cookies with a spatula before they cool. 4 dozen cookies.

#### Brownies

(With a Butterscotch Flavor!)

1-3 cup butter  
1-3 cup dark corn syrup  
1-3 cup brown sugar  
1 egg  
3/4 cup flour  
3-4 cup nutmeats  
Cream the butter and sugar; add corn syrup, well beaten egg, flour and nutmeats. Pour into a square pan, and bake in a moderate oven 20-25 minutes.

#### Banana Rolled Oats Cookies

(Brand New—It's News!)

1 1/2 cups sifted flour  
1/2 teasp. baking soda  
1/2 teasp. salt  
1/2 teasp. nutmeg  
1/2 teasp. cinnamon  
1/2 teasp. cloves  
1/2 cup shortening  
1 cup sugar  
1 egg, well beaten  
3/4 cup finely diced bananas  
1 3-4 cup rolled oats  
1/2 cup chopped nut meats  
Sift together the flour, soda, salt and spices. Rub shortening to a creamy consistency with the back of a spoon. Stir the sugar a few tablespoons at a time into the shortening beating until fluffy. Add banana, rolled oats and nut meats and mix thoroughly. Then add flour mixture to banana mixture and blend well. Drop by teaspoonfuls onto greased baking pans, about 1 1/2 inches apart. Bake in moderate oven for 15 minutes. Makes about four dozen cookies.
