COUNTY HOLDS FOURTH PLACE

At the close of the third month of 1938, Washington county held fourth place among Oregon's 10 Group I counties on the basis of improvement over 1937 in traffic accidents, injuries and deaths. Secretary of State Earl Snell reported this week.

Last month this county was ranked second.

Counties in Group I placed in the following order for their improvement during the first 3 months: Multnomah, Clackamas, Columbia, Washington, Portland, Clatsop, Marion, Benton, Polk, and Yamhill.

Lincoln county placed first among the seven Group II counties and Deschutes among the Group III counties.

During the first three months of this year there were 167 accidents, 42 injuries and 1 death reported from this county. Last year there were 160 accidents, 58 injuries and 2 deaths.

SCATTERED CASES WHOOPING COUGH

There are scattered cases of Whooping Cough in Washington County which are not enough to cause alarm but should be considered as the reason for any child's cough that hangs on or keeps getting worse.

Teachers have in the past been very successful in limiting the number of cases by excluding children who have a cough which lasts over a week without showing improvement. This article is written as an appeal to parents to uphold the teachers and school board in such action; because it is for the sake, not only of the child himself, but also the others in the school. Babies and small children are too often the innocent victims, and according to the State Board of Health, "Whooping Cough kills more babies under two years of age than any other communicable disease."

A reliable life insurance pamphlet states: "If your child shows the first signs of whooping cough, call the doctor, and follow his directions absolutely. He can do much to relieve the child's distress and to prevent bad after effects. The doctor may wish to use a vaccine, depending on the individual case."

Good care and careful feeding are very important and advice from the doctor should be carefully followed.

Many children lose weight and become very weak from whooping cough. In this condition, they easily get pneumonia, or even tuberculosis, and other serious diseases. Whooping cough

Certified Seed Proves To Be Cheapest

(Continued From First Page) be productive for at least six or seven years, frequently longer. The soundness of this idea has been borne out time and again by demonstration plantings and by actual results on farmers' plantings.

Liming the ground in preparation for alfalfa ordinarily costs from seven to fourteen dollars per acre; seed another four or five dollars per acre, and the preparation of the seed bed must be done a little more carefully and therefore at somewhat more expense than for some other crops. When these extra costs are taken into consideration it appears only reasonable that a grower should obtain the very best seed on the market. Actual experience and results locally indicate definitely that the most certain assurance the grower has as to quality, strain and variety is certification. Uncertified lots may sometimes prove satisfactory but a certain percentage practically always does not.

ROSE FESTIVAL TO BE JUNE 8 TO 11

Portland's Rose Festival will have more outside cities represented this year in its famous floral parade than in any recent festival, according to announcements by Ralph H. Cuke, president.

The parade will again be in the morning and is set for Friday of the four-day festival, June 8 to 11.

Oregon cities planning to enter floats, bands or marching bodies include Pendleton, Bend, The Dalles, Silverton, Albany, Oregon City, Salem, Newberg, Eugene, Grants Pass, St. Helens, Vernonia, Clatskanie, Beaverton and Astoria.

The Portland Rose society will hold its fiftieth annual rose show on the second and third day of the festival. In addition there will be the third annual air-mail rose show. Roses from the four corners of the nation will be flown to Portland by air-mail for this show.

Entertainment on a lavish scale will be provided each night in the stadium. A gigantic Merrykara parade on Saturday night will provide a merry ending for the big program.

REPORTS OF SURVEY ARE GIVEN

Moisture conditions throughout Oregon are not only the best in many cases in the last decade, but prospective stream flow and abundant supplies of water in reservoirs make certain the best irrigation season in years, according to the April report on the snow surveys and irrigation water forecasts for Oregon.

This report is issued from the Medford branch experiment station, which is the headquarters for the cooperative work by which measurements are kept on some 675 snow courses in Oregon, from which calculations and forecasts are later made.

Every one of Oregon's 17 principal irrigation storage reservoirs is either filled beyond the level noted last year at this time, or has been purposely allowed to remain only partially filled as a means of flood control later in the season. Stream flow throughout the state for the coming summer is forecast to be materially better than last year, with the exception of the Umatilla-Walla Walla basin.

Although winter runoff has been heavy, thus permitting more water in the McKay and Cold Springs reservoirs, snow fall in this one region is less than usual, which will affect the late season flow.

In other sections of the state snow supplies are greater than usual in the higher elevations, and in addition the soil under the snow is generally in an unfrozen, water-soaked condition, as contrasted to the dry and frozen soil on which last year's snow lay.

Arch Work, superintendent of the Medford station and head of the snow survey work carried on by the United States bureau of agricultural engineering and co-operating agencies, recently completed the third annual series of regional meetings throughout the state for the consideration of data gathered this past winter. Most of the co-operating agencies were represented at these round table discussions, where forecasts for each region were agreed upon.

DUSTING STARTED DURING PAST WEEK

(Continued From First Page) bug would still be a very profitable investment for any strawberry grower.

Where the dust is to be done, it should be completed before the spittle insects have become scattered all over the plant. The dust should be applied while the insects are not surrounded by too much foam and while they are, for the most part, in bud clusters and around the base of the leaf and fruit stems.

There has not been any noticeable difference in the effectiveness of a rotenone dust regardless of the source of the rotenone. It seems that rotenone from the derris plant is just as effective as if from the cube plant. A dust carrying one-half of one percent rotenone has been found effective and is the strength recommended.
