### YOUR NAME IN PRINT

It is an old saying that one's name is pretty apt to get into the local paper at least three times; at birth, at marriage and at death. But in the light of time and eternity, four events should be looked at: Birth, Death, Resurrection; Judgment Day.

1.—BIRTH. The Bible says we become sinners on this earth. "All have sinned," sinners by nature, by choice and by practice.

2.—DEATH. "It is appointed unto men once to die." Most folks agree to that.

3.—RESURRECTION. All are to be raised. The saved and the lost alike. Rich man, poor man, beggerman and chief—"All that are in the graves shall hear His voice and come forth." John 5:28-29.

4.—JUDGEMENT DAY. God's people are to be raised to the Resurrection of Life and the lost to the Resurrection of Condemnation. See John 5:28-29.
