Mrs. A. H. Watson entertained several children on Sunday in honor of her little nephew, Larry Gardiner, who was five years old.

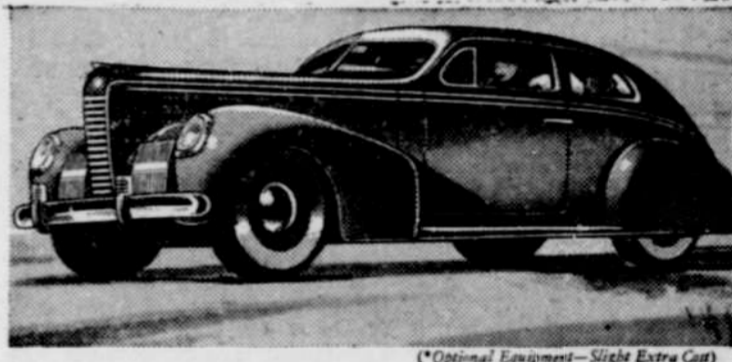
