



HERB COOKERY NEW? OLD AS TIME!

It's revival day for herbs in cookery. Quite a vogue have herbs enjoyed of late, reminding many a kitchen of the ancient art of "yarb" cooking. There's nothing new about using herbs to flavor food, goodness knows—and goodness is the correct word! The Old Testament mentions parsley, mint and thyme. Onions, chives, and shallots were known by Cleopatra. Caraway seeds were found in the ancient lake dwellings of Switzerland; mustard was a favorite of the Brahmins in very old India. In America Indians and Colonials exchanged recipes and herbs—sassafras powder (file in New Orleans) for gumbo; rose water for cakes; thyme for chicken (Washington liked his that way) marjoram for almost everything. But it's new again now!

MODERN SIMPLING

"Simpling" is the grand old name for collecting herbs for cookery; so let's call it that, and learn the three basic ways to flavor with herbs; one is to actually add the herbs (like a bay leaf to your stew) to the food; a second is to mince the green herbs fine and sprinkle them over your food before serving (everybody has certainly served parsleyed potatoes); the third is to use the essence of the herb—dill pickle juice, or tarragon vinegar, for instance.

SAVORY MEAT PATTIES

1 egg
1 1/2 teaspoons salt
1/4 teaspoon pepper
1 1/4 cups milk
1 cup all-bran
1 lb. ground round steak
2 lbs. finely chopped onion
1 1/2 cups chopped parsley
10 slices bacon

Beat egg and add salt, pepper, milk and all-bran. Combine meat with onion and parsley. Add the soaked bran and mix well. Form into cakes about two inches thick in diameter and one inch thick. Wrap slice of bacon around each cake and fasten with skewer. Bake in hot oven (450° F.) for 30 minutes.

minutes or broil for 20 minutes. Serve with Spanish Sauce. Yield 5 servings.

CARAWAY COOKIES

2 eggs, beaten
1 cup sugar
1 cup thick cream
3 cups flour
3 teaspoons phosphate baking powder
1 teaspoon salt
1 1/2 teaspoons caraway seeds

Add sugar gradually to beaten eggs; add cream, and mix together. Add flour mixed with baking powder, salt and caraway seeds. Chill dough, roll on floured board and cut into desired shapes. Bake in moderate oven (350° F.) until done.

STUFFED OLIVE DRESSING

1 teaspoon salt
1 teaspoon dry mustard
1 teaspoon sugar
1 teaspoon paprika
1/4 teaspoon cayenne
2 tablespoons catsup
1 cup salad oil
1/4 cup vinegar
1 small bottle stuffed olives

Mix all dry ingredients and catsup together. Beat well; add salad oil, teaspoonful at a time, beating well after each addition. Add vinegar gradually, beating constantly. Add olives, sliced and chilled. Serve on green salad. 1 1/2 cups dressing.

BRAZIL NUT STUFFING

2 medium-sized onions, minced
1/2 cup melted butter
2 cups sliced Brazil nuts
Salt and pepper
8 cups soft bread crumbs
Sage or mixed herbs

Saute onions for 2 minutes in butter. Combine Brazil nuts and seasonings with bread crumbs and add to butter. Cook 2 minutes, stirring constantly. If dry add a little water. Good with roast chicken.

GRAPEFRUIT GREEN SALAD

Line salad bowl with lettuce, chicory and watercress. Add sliced celery, sliced radishes, and canned grapefruit sections drained from juice; sprinkle with celery seed and chopped olives; add diced avocado and serve with French dressing.
